Wow, it's hard to believe that we are already halfway through the Season of Lent.

On February 14, 2024, of this year we began the Season of Lent with ashes marked upon our foreheads in the sign of the cross to remind us of our mortality. But these ashes were much more than that.

A quick reading of the history of soap described to us in ancient texts teaches us that ashes have long been an important ingredient of soap, and that ashes have even been substituted for soap as a cleansing agent. Paradoxically, the filthy Ashen Cross that we wore on our foreheads highlights our desire to come clean.

And the Ashen Cross on our foreheads displays our desire to get our spiritual house in order so we can participate in the Triduum, the Three Holy Days that lead up to Easter. Did you know that the Triduum is made up Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday.

It is during these three days (The Triduum) that we hear again the grace that is ours in Christ as we recall how God cleaned up the mess that we made in His creation.

The Season of Lent gives us a chance to get our spiritual life in order before the Easter Celebration. And it gives us an opportunity to hear again how Jesus took upon Himself the sin of the world, defeated death, and destroyed the power of the evil one.

As we journey through March this year, let us again assess our lives as we prepare for the spring cleaning that we celebrate each year during the Triduum.

And let us all remember that it is not too late to prepare ourselves for the Triduum, and the Easter Victory given to us through the Redeeming Activity of Jesus Christ our Lord.

Let us continue our journey through these forty days to the great Three Days of Jesus' death and resurrection.

Merciful God, accompany our journey through these forty days. Renew us in the gift of baptism, that we may provide for those who are poor, pray for those in need, fast from self-indulgence, and above all that we may find our treasure in the life of your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, Amen.

May God fill your heart with gladness to cheer you.




Hear Ye, Hear ye, Ladies of Calvary,


