Council's Corner

Calvary Lutheran Church Council Meeting

09 September 2019

The meeting was called to order at 6:45 p.m. on the 09th day of September 2019 by the Council President Fritz Leifeste. Pastor Paul gave a devotional on how separation from material things is always inedible, but separation from God can never be destroyed. He opened with a prayer.

MEMBERS PRESENT: Joyce O'Connell, Chris Kinsey, Fritz Leifeste, Kara Martinez, Linda Ortegon, Teddi Phillips, Betty Thane, Barbara Walker, Marie Williams, John Ulrich, and Pastor Paul Zwarich.

MINUTES: Marie Williams motioned to accept the August 12, 2019 original Council Meeting minutes as presented and Kara Martinez second the motion. The motion passed.

TREASURER'S REPORT: John Ulrich presented the Financial Report as of August 31, 2019, and it was approved as presented. The 2020 Budget Committee members are: Pastor Paul Zwarich, Elwin Hahn, Leon Thane, Crystal Purington, Lou St. Germain, John Ulrich and President Fritz Leifeste.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT: Joyce O'Connell presented a printed report with the weekly and monthly attendance figures and offerings for the current year.

CORE TEAM REPORTS:

Education – Marie Williams said Rally Day was well attended. The theme was "Service", what it meant and how it applied to our life as Christians. On September 8 in appreciation of First Responders Day (September 11), the Sunday school students sacked candy for the eight San Angelo Fire Stations and the San Angelo Police Department - the main office and annex. The sacks were delivered by several of our congregation members since the students were in school. The next committee meeting is scheduled for September 22, 2019.

Fellowship – Kara Martinez reported that everyone enjoyed the August 25th Rally Day. Potluck is scheduled for the last Sunday in September. Thanksgiving Dinner will be November 17, 2019.

Service and Justice – Betty Thane reported the year to date funds received through the "Noisy Bucket" mission is \$593.52. "God's Work Our Hands Day", on September 8, 2019, 440lbs of beans and rice was bagged for "Project Dignidad. The church provided pizza in appreciation to those that helped.

Worship – Teddi Phillips said the next worship team meeting is scheduled for October 13, 2019 while the next Altar Guild meeting is scheduled for November 02, 2019. She is working to complete the 2020 worship budget and will have it ready by September 13, 2019.

Evangelism - Barbara Walker suggested several good ideas: One being the importance of building relationships within the church and beyond Calvary. Creating small groups from members within the church was one. The groups would meet once a month in the home of a member. A meal or snack would be served. Games could be played, or a preselected biblical topic or book could be discussed. Knowing or memorizing our own faith story would be very useful in case the opportunity arose to share it. Setting up a table at the Chicken Farm Event held once a month might be a good way to let the community know who Calvary Lutheran is. Balloons, water and church information could be given away. Calvary Lutheran also gets involved in the community through allowing AAA meetings to be held at the church, Meals for the Elderly, Good Gifts, Day Camp Outreach, Project Dignidad and helps with financial assistance. Recruiting new committee members was suggested since several of the current members are leaders on a few other committees.

PASTOR'S REPORT:

Pastor Paul presented the Pastor's Report. Pastoral Acts included: One letter of transfer, three Holy Communion's served at homes and twenty-one served at nursing homes. He also identified several meetings and activities that had taken place. Meetings included the August 4, 2019 Fellowship Committee Meeting, August 11, 2019 Worship Committee Meeting, August 13, 2019 75th Anniversary Committee Meeting, August 14, 2019 Evangelism Committee Meeting, September 05, 2019 Executive Meeting and September 05, 2019 the Social Justice Committee Meeting. Activities included Christians in Action, Adult Sunday Mornings Bible Study, Lutheran Diners, Rally Day, the COW conference meeting and God's Work Our Hands Sunday. Upcoming Events: Pastor Paul's vacation. September 13 through September 22, 2019. Canceled September 24, 2019 Clergy Pre-Retirement Seminar at First Lutheran Church in Temple, September 29, 2019 Church Potluck. More events coming are: October 07-October 09 Bishop Convocation @ Briarwood, October 13, 2019 Worship Committee Meeting, November – January Hymn Selection TBD, November 10, 2019 Semi-Annual Congregational Meeting, November 17, 2019 Sunday Thanksgiving Dinner, December 04, 2019 Mid-Week Advent Services Start. Times Pastor Paul will be out of the office are: February 18 – 20-2020, April 24 -25, 2020 Synod Assemble @ Pat Quin College Dallas, July 20-23-2020 for Rostered Ministers Gathering Phoenix AZ. Pastor Paul will be on vacation, September 20-September 26, 2020. Pulpit Supply is needed September 20, 2020.

OLD BUSINESS:

Committee Budgets: Committee Budgets are due by the middle of September. Fall Congregational Meeting: The council was reminded of the upcoming Semi-Annual Fall Congregational Meeting to be held November 10, 2019. Thanksgiving Dinner: This year's Thanksgiving Dinner is planned for Sunday November 17. Lawn Landscape: Barbara Walker presented a lawn landscaping estimate that was over the funds budgeted for the project. The estimate included the placement of large stone rocks. By removing the large stones, it appeared the cost would be within budget. The council asked Barbara to get a revised estimate that excluded the large stone rocks. Barbara agreed. Church Sign: John Ulrich said our church insurance would pay some toward the replacement of the digital sign in front of the church. The cost of the sign will be \$20,500.00. The funds to pay for the sign is primarily received through church donations. Chris Kinsey presented a motion to purchase the new sign once all the funds were received. The council team agreed to the motion.

NEW BUSINESS:

Worship Services: It was approved for Joyce O'Connell to lead worship services and give communion September 15 and September 22 of 2019 while Pastor Paul is on vacation. Council Retreat: May be scheduled for late October. Realm Ministry "ACS Technologies: Joyce O'Connell presented a recommendation from Realm Ministry. ACS Technologies created a cloud-based software designed to connect church staff and their congregation together by integrating the core components of running a successful ministry's administration, accounting and community. We are currently using the Roll Call system. Joyce will confirm we have the required hardware necessary to integrate with ACS Technologies. She will also confirm pricing. Synod Assembly: April 24-25, 2020 in Dallas, Texas. Synod Assembly Delegates need to be confirmed. Church Directory: Marie Williams said hiring a business to produce our church directory was expensive. It was suggested for us to take the photos of our members and download them to an online photo website to produce the directory. A couple of members said they may know individuals that might be willing to take the photos inexpensively. Church Sign Update: John Ulrich submitted a total cost of \$20,500 to our insurance company to replace the digital sign in front of the church. Our insurance policy will pay \$425.00 toward the replacement. Funds to pay for the sign is primary received through church donations and special gifts. As of September 08, 2019, \$18,945.00 has been received for the sign. Lawn Landscaping Proposals: Barbara Walker presented an estimate from Bird's Eye Landscape for \$5250.00 and an estimate from Xeriscape Landscape for \$4,800.00. Chris Kinsey motioned to accept the proposed estimate from Xeriscape. Kara Martinez seconded the motion. All was in favor. The estimate from Xeriscape was approved.

CLOSING: There being no further business, the meeting duly closed at 8:20 P.M. in peace and harmony with the Lord's Prayer.

November Liturgical Color(s):

White for All Saints Sunday (Nov. 3). All Saints Sunday is considered a "Lesser Festival" and apparently, white is used for most of the lesser festivals. The ELCA says, "Lesser festivals and commemorations are white, unless a martyr is celebrated, in which case bright red is suggested." I might have found one reason *why* we use white for that particular day, however. One source I found said that the Saints' robes were washed white in the blood of the Lamb.

Green- Season after Pentecost (Nov. 10, 17). Green is used for its symbolism of our growth in Christ. (ELCA.org, 2017)

White Christ the King Sunday is the final day of the church year and it uses white, a festive color suggesting light, joy, and the celebration of our Lord. The colors serve to adorn the worship space, and to call attention to the nature of the season or festival being celebrated. (ELCA.org, 2017)

<u>Hymn of the Month</u> - Worship and Praise 81, Kyrie Eleison (Dakota Road). Consider reading/singing the hymn as a prayer in the privacy of your heart and mind. Don't have access to a hymnal? You can find the lyrics on DigitalSongsAndHymns.com. Type "*Kyrie Eleison lead line*" in the search box, and click on the one that lists the Worship and Praise Hymn book next to it (it's the first one listed). Would you like to sing along? Go to YouTube.com and type "*ELW Setting 8*" (No, that is not a typo!) I recommend https://www.youtube.com/watch? v=yFq1stGOfGc.


