From the Pastor:

It is hard to fathom the despair the disciples must have felt on the night that Jesus was crucified. Did they sleep that night? Did they eat? Did they sit huddled together as a group for comfort and support or did they scatter?

In a period of one week, so much had changed. Just a few days earlier everything was wonderful as they escorted Jesus through the streets of Jerusalem while the crowd waved palm branches, spread their cloaks on the road and shouted, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!"

But then – disaster. Betrayal by one of the disciples. A night-time arrest. A trial. And then death by crucifixion. In just a period of twenty-four hours all the joy was gone. Jesus, their beloved teacher, was dead and now the disciples worried that they too might be hunted down and executed. Shock, grief, despair, confusion, fear, all consumed the disciples as they tried to make sense of all that had just happened.

But it was not the end, because Sunday followed Saturday and resurrection followed death. Death could not cancel life. The grave could not cancel Christ's presence with us. Crucifixion could not cancel the grace of God.

When Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to the tomb, they were greeted by an angel who said, "Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him.' This is my message for you."

And the women left the tomb with fear and great joy as they ran to tell the disciples what they had just seen and heard. Jesus was alive. But his resurrection was not a resurrection that would just merely resume life from where it had left off, but a resurrection that would unleash God's redeeming grace upon his creation. As Jesus said, "Unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains by itself alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit."

Today, all of humanity is experiencing fear as the corona virus cancels events and separates us from each other. Social distancing has become the new norm. Sporting events – cancelled. Gatherings over 100, 50, even 10 people – cancelled. Greeting one another with a handshake at worship – cancelled. Sharing a common cup as we celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Communion – cancelled. In just a very short time our life together has changed, and fear has taken a hold in our lives.

But the Good News is that our darkest times, and our moments of greatest despair, will end. The light will shine again, not to bring a return to the way things were but to bring a new beginning filled with hope.

In the meantime, remember that even though some things have been cancelled; the grace of God has not been cancelled. Even though we may be forced to limit activities at church, the forgiveness of sin has not been cancelled. Even though our daily routines have been disrupted, the hope we have based upon the grace Jesus will bring us when He is fully revealed has not been cancelled.

And that is why we can celebrate Easter today and shout, "Alleluia! Christ Is Risen! Christ Is Risen Indeed! Alleluia! "

Council Meeting Minutes - January 13, 2020

MINUTES: John motioned to accept the November 2019 Council Meeting minutes as presented. Marie motioned to accept and Kara second the motion. The motion passed.

TREASURER'S REPORT: John Ulrich presented the Financial Report as presented December 31, 2019, and it was approved as presented.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT: Joyce O'Connell presented a printed report with the weekly and monthly attendance figures and offerings for the 2019 year. Total 2019 annual contributions compared to 2018 was up.

CORE TEAM REPORTS:

Education – Marie Williams said the committee members Pastor Zwarich, Gary Griffin, Kara Martinez and herself will only meet only as needed. Blossom Parry will begin teaching the 1st-5th grades Sunday School Class. Marie will be teaching the 8th-12th grades Sunday School Class: Study of Hebrew ordered. The committee will have the opportunity to preview the talk to make sure it's positive and audience appropriate. Betty will meet with Joyce to identify and resolve the small difference in the noisy bucket year in totals.

Worship – Bee Rose was introduced as the worship committee chairperson. The executive committee approved Bee to serve interim until the position is filled. Welcome Bee Rose.

Evangelism - Barbara Walker believes by starting small group studies it would create an opportunity for members to get know each other. She would like to pursue this and would welcome input.

The council tabled the decision to give the Lent Mid-Week Offering to the National Association of Mental Illness "NAMI" Texas Chapter in San Angelo, Texas pending more information on how they serve our local community. 



He broke the age-bound chains of hell; the bars from heaven's high portals fell. Let hymns of praise His triumph tell. Alleluia!


Lord, by the stripes which wounded Thee, from death's dread sting Thy servants free, that we may live and sing to Thee. Alleluia!
