Calvary Lutheran Church Council Meeting 10 June 2019

The meeting was called to order at 6:37 p.m. on the 10th day of June, 2019, by the Council President Fritz Leifeste. Pastor Paul Zwarich offered a devotional and a prayer.

MEMBERS PRESENT: Fritz Leifeste. Barbara Walker, John Ulrich, Betty Thane, Dorothy St. Germain, Joyce O'Connell, Marie Williams, James Parry, and Pastor Paul Zwarich. The newly elected Council Secretary, Linda Ortegon, and Leon Thane were also present.

MINUTES: John Ulrich motioned, seconded by Marie Williams, that the minutes of the 13 May, 2019, Council meeting be accepted as presented. The motion passed.

TREASURER'S REPORT: John Ulrich presented the Financial Report as of 31 May, 2019. No exceptions were taken to the report, and it was approved as presented.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT: Joyce O'Connell presented a printed report which showed the weekly and monthly attendance figures and offerings for the current year.

CORE TEAM REPORTS:

Education – Marie Williams reported that the church was required to have background checks processed on every person who was to have direct contact with children in the Day Camp program. The local police department will be contacted about this matter. The youth have elected to have a calendar sale as a fundraiser project.

Fellowship – Kara Martinez presented a written report. She expressed her thanks to Dorothy St. Germain, Pam Ulrich, Diane Ross, Betty Thane, and Joyce O'Connell for helping with the Fellowship programs. Also, it was noted that Pedro Montanez and Lou St. Germain did a superior job of cooking the hamburgers and hot dogs.

Service and Justice – Betty Thane reported that the Noisy Bucket collection for May amounted to \$53.64 for the Good Gifts Program.

Worship – Dorothy St. Germain reported that she had been working with Teddi Phillips, the newly elected team leader. Teddi has had a lot of experience with the Worship and Music programs and will be a great blessing to the services.

Evangelism – Barbara Walker reported that the bookmarks are being well used by the members. John Ulrich motioned, seconded by Joyce O'Connell, to increase the Evangelism budget by \$300.00. The motion passed.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Paul Zwarich reported on the many official duties and actions he had conducted in May and June. He told about a stranger coming by his office and asking about a small, sick dog that had been left at the front of the church one morning. He said that he had left his dog there because it was ill, and he did not have money to take him to the veterinarian, and he hoped that someone would care for his dog.

The Pastor told him that someone from the church had taken the dog to the doctor and after it was healed, the dog was adopted to a new home. The stranger was happy that his dog had been well taken care of by some of the church members.

OLD BUSINESS: John Ulrich reported that the rain gutters on the church building had been cleaned out and the trash removed. The Council is scheduled to start planning the kitchen upgrades in July and start remodeling work in August.

NEW BUSINESS: The installation of the Church Council for the coming year was set for 30 June, 2019. The problem with dirt and mud washing off the ground by the front doorway and into the parking lot was discussed. Several members stated they would talk to their personal lawn maintenance crew about possible solutions. The council thanked Dorothy St. Germain for her service on the Worship Team and James Parry for his four years serving as the Council Secretary.

CLOSING: There being no further business, the meeting was duly closed at 7:36 p.m. in peace and harmony with the Lord's Prayer.

Parish Education News for August:

Day Camp met June 24th - 28th from 8:45 a.m. to 3:45 p.m. The Counselors from Cross Trails Ministry arrived at 8:00 a.m. and left about 5:00 p.m. most days. Junior Counselors, along with their siblings, arrived at 8:15 and left about 3:45. Exceptions for early drop off were given to one Calvary family due to work schedules and no other family members being available for drop off. One church member arrived at church at 7:30 a.m. to accommodate this family. On Monday, we had 28 campers registered: 8 in first grade, 12 in grades 2 and 3, and 8 in grades 4, 5, and 6. Seven campers did not come due to unforeseen circumstances. That left us with 6 in 1st, 9 in 2nd/3rd, and 6 in 4th/5th/6th. We also had 6 Junior Counselors.

We had more than 300 volunteer hours donated by our church in this outreach project. People donated more than \$300 in money and/or food donations. A couple of the parents/grandparents stated that their child/children enjoyed the program immensely.

The highlights of the week were the times spent at the College Hills Swim and Racquet Club and the closing devotional program. After the swimming, which included jumping off diving boards and sliding down slides, the campers as well as the adults were ready for lunch and a nap. BIG THANKS go to Adam, Heather, Crystal, Neil, and Teddi for facing that time in the pool. Thrivent paid for the rental of the pool, so thanks go to them, also. The campers had daily Bible Study that transferred to the games they played and the prayers they prayed.

My thanks go to all the members who shared the week's toils and pain, as well as the love and laughter. The kitchen helpers shined with their speed, endurance and upbeat mood. Thank you to the secretary and Pastor Paul for putting up with the interruption to their daily schedule as well as their participation when asked. My Junior Counselors in the congregation lived up to the high expectations we set for them in their interaction with the campers younger than themselves, as well as their interaction with the adults around them. My thanks also goes to the members who bought and brought things for Day Camp, as well as the ones who donated money and time in support of Day Camp. And lastly, my thanks go to the whole congregation for the outreach effort to touch children's lives with God's work and our hands.

By the way, campers are already asking if we're going to have Day Camp next year, and those going into seventh grade are asking if they can be Junior Counselors. That is how much they love it!
