Church Council

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. on the 14TH day of June 2021 by the Council President Fritz Leifeste. Pastor Paul opened with the devotion "What can we compare this Kingdom of God to?" Small Congregations do not need to be big to be faithful. Small Congregation are a little bit like the small mustard seed. Germinating faith quietly. Pastor opened with prayer.

MINUTES: Fritz motion to accept the May 10, 2021, Calvary Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes. Joyce moved to accept the May minutes. Chris second the motion. The council approved the May Calvary Lutheran Church Council Minutes.

TREASURER'S REPORT: John Ulrich. John said a payment due in April was made in May. Otherwise, May would have been an average month. The Treasurer's report was accepted as submitted.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT: Joyce O'Connell. Joyce said over all May was an average month. Joyce made the comment that tracking the attendance on Zoom and Facebook was a challenge. Chris suggested that a comment for those attending via Facebook be posted requesting the attendee to post a comment if they were a member or a visitor. If they were a member to give their name as well. The Financial Secretary's Report was accepted as submitted by the council.

CORE TEAM REPORTS

Education: Heidi Wierkzowiecki. Nothing to report. Ann will lead the adult bible study this fall. Blossom and Linda will assist Heidi as needed.

Fellowship: Dorothy St. Germain. Nothing to report. Dorothy said she would enjoy having a church picnic again.

Service and Justice: Marie Williams. Absent. Fritz said

the only thing Marie had to report was Eighty-seven dollars was collected in our first noisy bucket collection.

Worship: Bee Rose. The worship music was selected earlier in the year all the way through July and that has worked at well. Next month the worship committee will meet to select music for the upcoming months. It was also mentioned that on the last Sunday of the months June, July and August the "Kyrie" for "The Chosen People" will be done.

Evangelism: Ann Helm. Nothing to report.

Pastor's Report: Pastor had four in Person/Facebook Sunday Worship Services. One Worship Service in Miles. He had a couple of home visits and nine office visits. He attended the Semi-Annual Congregation Meeting as well as the Internship Conference and Training Zoom Event during May. He had two internship Zoom meetings and one Youth Gathering meeting per Zoom. The Youth Gathering is scheduled to be held 2022 in Minneapolis. If there are three or less attendees, they will go with the Bishop's group. The cost is \$1200.00 per attendee. The Bishop was here on May 23, 2021, for Confirmation. Pastor attended the Cow Conference on June 12. The Summer 2021 Briarwood Program will be the "Crowded Table". God's Work Our Hands is the same weekend as the Gathering Together SYNOD event that Fritz and the Pastor will be attending. We may need to discuss moving God's Work Our Hands to another date. Pastor would like to have three or four people to attend the Faithful Innovation Meeting on September 18, 2021. The next COW Conference Meeting will be October 16, 2021. The NT-NL Briarwood Leadership Convention will be October 18-20, 2021. Pastor will be on vacation July 27-31, 2021, September 25 - October 03, 2021, and May 15, 2022 - May 21, 2022. He will also be on vacation June 09 – June 22, 2023, Calvary's 75th Anniversary Celebration will be Sunday October 16, 2022. Leon said since the restrictions have been lifted the committee will move forward with arranging a location.

Old Business

This Sunday is the Service of Beginning for the new intern in Miles. Joyce has been approved by the Bishop to precede over communion in the Pastor's absence. Also, Miles has invited anyone who would like to attend their service at 10:30am that Sunday is welcomed. Pastor had one person volunteer, so he will be asking three people who he thinks would be able to commit to the Faithful Innovations Education training schedule. New mics will be installed in the church sanctuary so the people attending on Facebook will be able to hear the singing coming from the congregation. Pastor will inform the congregation before the mics are installed; the mics are extremely sensitive and will pick up background conversations. The council would like to create a new church directory of our members. In order to reduce the cost of creating the directory it was suggested our church secretary could take photos of the members. We could have a schedule of time slots the members could sign up for. The council felt there was still a lot to discuss so left it as an open item on old business. Ann Helm said she has been attending the NT-NL workshop on racism every Tuesday. She said fifty-seven people have been attending from all over the Synod. They meet in break out groups. The meetings have not been emotional

story telling sessions but are purely academic. The study is from books or excerpts. Ann said she was learning a different perspective from what she knew. Ann also said each session is independent of the others so if anyone wanted to join, they could.

New Business

The council agreed to move forward with the church picnic. Hot Dogs, Hamburgers will be served. Fritz motioned to have the picnic on Sunday July 18. Bee motioned to accept the motion. Joyce second the motion. The council approved. The council agreed to have "An All-Committee Meeting" on Saturday August 14th 9:00 a.m. at the church. The council also agreed to install the new council members on Sunday July 11, 2021.

The Meeting ended with "The Lord's Prayer".






First Communion Instruction

Points to Ponder:

Do you ever think you just worship by rote? I know I did for far too many years! I thought, because I had memorized different parts of the service, ie. The Apostles Creed, Kyrie, etc., I was being a good worshipper. The problem I found was that I was reciting by rote. I wasn't actually paying attention to what the words meant. We attend church to worship the Lord. This means to actually listen to what we are saying, understand and adhere to what they say and the rituals we have in place. Until I read the article below I never thought about it like that.

Rituals Mark Us For Healing

One of the most powerful ways that can be incarnated, and stories can be told is through ritual. We know and understand that water, bread and wine, together with the word of God, tell God's story and sacramentally bring us forgiveness, life and salvation. We know that oil touch and prayers draw us into God's healing mercy. We know that candles lit in prayer help us to more fully understand light defying despair. We know that marking ourselves with the cross of Christ reminds us, sometimes against all external data, who and whose we are.




