The Christmas Eve Service will also be held via Zoom and in-person at 7 pm on December 24, 2020. The Congregation Council will continue to monitor the latest developments concerning the corona virus and will keep the congregation advised of any changes to our planned activities.

One phrase I have heard over, and over again is that Christmas this year will be like no other Christmas that we have experienced in the past. While it may be true that past customs and traditions may be altered or cancelled the message of the season will remain the same. Luke 2:9-11 sums up this message well. The text reads as follows:

**Calvary Lutheran Church Council Meeting**

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of October 2020 by the Council President Fritz Leifeste. Pastor Paul opened with a prayer. Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts. Let our Thank-fulness overflow in our praises and in our actions. Let us be mindful of your will for us. Lord thank you for all that gather with us tonight, but most of all for our Lord and Savior.

**MEMBERS PRESENT**: Joyce O'Connell, Chris Kinsey, Fritz Leifeste, Linda Ortegon, Bee Rose, Betty Thane, Barbara Walker, Marie Williams, John Ulrich, and Pastor Paul Zwarich

**MINUTES**: Fritz motion to accept the September 2020 Calvary Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes. Marie made a motion to accept the minutes. Bee second the motion. The council approved.

**TREASURER'S REPORT**: John Ulrich. The September 2020 Treasurer's Report and was approved as presented. John mentioned we were still looking ok.

**FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT**: Joyce O'Connell. The Financial Report was accepted as reported. Joyce said we're pretty consistent. September was up from August. However, August had five Sundays instead of the normal four. Other than that we are doing okay considering the circumstances.

#### **CORE TEAM REPORTS**

**Education**: Marie Williams. Nothing new to report.

Fellowship: Kara Martinez. Absence.

**Social and Justice**: Betty Thane. Betty said she and Marie have discussed doing God's Work, Our Hands with the beans and rice. A final solution has not been decided, but they did entertain setting up a couple of different stations with a signup sheet. This way social distancing guidelines could be met. Another idea discussed was to let the rice and beans be taken home to be bagged there. If the council didn't have any objections she will continue with the planning. The council agreed she should continue.

**Worship**: Bee Rose. Nothing new to report. Except for she has kind of established at least one person that she can go to as a Eucharist minister and that is Ida Walter's brother, Glen. The pastor went with Bee on the first visit and she went last week but this week's visit is still pending. Bee and Pastor chose hymns until the end of December.

**Evangelism**: Barbara Walker. Nothing new to report.

#### Pastor's Report:

Pastor said one thing he wanted to say about our attendance is that we are actually tracking pretty well. We have been averaging 20-25 in the sanctuary and about the same number on zoom. That means we have been averaging 50 almost 60 in total attendance of Sunday worship service. Phyllis has been taking attendance each Sunday so we have a record and the church secretary, Shelly, created a spreadsheet to track who is attending in person and who is attending per zoom and we are actually tracking very well all things considered. Pastor went over his pastoral acts. Four in person and zoom Sunday Worship Services. One Worship Service in Miles. One graveside service for Miles. There was a zoom Synod Assembly two weeks ago. The music was wonderful. It was an eye opening experience to what can go right and what can go wrong having a zoom meeting with that many people, but again we're all working through the bugs. There was a budget committee meeting held and that report will be given later in our meeting today. A Seventy-fifth anniversary meeting was held and we are just two years away from the event. We are watching to see what is going to happen with the restaurants. Will they be open and still be in business. There is a lot going on. As we talk to the restaurant owners, they are really worried about

their bottom line right now. Pastor attended one council meeting yesterday in Miles and the intent to apply for an intern was completed. The rest of the application has to be in by January 2021, but we declared our intent to do that. There were four adult bible studies and four Confirmation lessons since we last met. Pastor did an invocation at Pedro's Navy Retirement Ceremony. The COW Conference meeting that was scheduled for October 03 in Abilene was postpone to February due to restrictions at that location. Pastor will be out of the office this Friday and Saturday. He and Phyllis are taking an Amtrak Train ride for Phyllis's birthday. Pastor has continuing education coming up October 19 and 20<sup>th</sup> via zoom that is the Bishop Convocation. We are going to receive two new members on Reformation Sunday. Lori Smithwick and Elaine Welty. The following week is all Saints Sunday, November 1<sup>st</sup>. Then we have our Semi-Annual congregational meeting which will be discussed later tonight. The mid-week advent services will soon be upon us so next month we need to decide if the midweek advent services will be held. This vear devotional advent books have been purchased for everyone in the congregation. The devotional advent books will be given out so they can be taken home. The Christmas Eve service will be at 7pm that evening. Later in this meeting a decision will be made if a Thanksgiving meal should be held this year. We also need to decide if the Epiphany meal will be held in January 2021. Pastor said his cruise has been officially canceled but he would still like to take a week off in January. Ash Wednesday will be February 17<sup>th</sup>. The Synod Assembly will be April 23rd - 24th. Our delegates will need to be selected by our Semi Annual Congregation Meeting for this event.

#### **New Business**

John provided a copy of the new 2021 Budget. The council didn't have any questions of John. A motion to accept the 2021 Budget was given.Marie moved to accept and Joyce second the motion. The council approved to present the 2021 Budget at the congregation meeting. Since it is a budget submitted by the council John can move to have the budget approved and there does not need to be a

second motion to accept it. Fritz presented a copy of the proposed agenda for the Semi-Annual Congregation Meeting which is actually our Annual this year. The council agreed to count the members in the service and the members per Zoom in attendance. The agenda shows to consider the 2021 Budget, election of council members and the selection of two delegates for the Synod Assembly in April. Fritz presented a motion to accept this agenda. Bee motioned to accept and Barbara second the motion. The council approved. Two new members will be accepted on Reformation Sunday. All Saints Sunday the council agreed to use the candles. The council discussed having Thanksgiving Dinner this year. Betty motioned not to have it and Chris second the motion. The council agreed. Barbara suggested we do something to celebrate Thanksgiving since we are not having a meal. Marie said especially for those that don't have family members around them.

The council will come up with some suggestions and discuss it in our November meeting. Fritz said if the council wanted to suggest someone as a delegate to the Synod Assembly in April to let him know and he could talk to them if needed. Pastor mentioned about Betty's nomination report. Right now we don't have anyone nominated for Education, but he is not worried about that right now because the church is experiencing change and how committees are organized is changing in many congregations. Since we don't have a lot of youth, it's difficult to plan lessons and activities so that can get very discouraging for someone. This is something the council should discuss in the future. The meeting was closed with Lord's Prayer.
