During our Mid-Week Lenten services this year' we will focus on the Book of Proverbs and hear several short sayings that teach us how to live life skillfully from God's point of view. In case you did not know it, proverbs are short sayings that take the place of a long explanation. They are practical, timeless, and relevant.

Proverbs deal with real life day-to-day issues. Benjamin Franklin was so fascinated with the Book of Proverbs that he compiled his own list of proverbs in a book entitled "Poor Richard's Almanac." Today some of us are familiar with many of his proverbs. For instance: "A stitch in time saves nine." "All that glitters is not gold." And "A penny saved is a penny earned."

Sometimes proverbs get mangled if one has not heard them before. One first grade teacher asked her students to complete several proverbs that she thought that they might have heard before, and their response was hilarious. The teacher asked: "Don't bite the hand that..." and the students responded: "Looks dirty." The teacher then asked: "A penny saved is..." and the students responded: "not much." The teacher inquired: "You can't teach an old dog new..." and the students yelled out "math." The teacher then asked: "It's always darkest before..." and the students answered: "Daylight Savings time."

Not all proverbs are hilarious. Some are very serious. But all proverbs are very helpful to us. The Book of Proverbs helps us discern what is beneficial for this life and teaches us to reflect upon the values/wisdom that God expects from us as we live in this world.

**TREASURER'S REPORT:** John Ulrich. The Treasurer's report was accepted as presented.

**FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT:** Leon Thane presented the report for October. Facebook attendance and views is listed. We're averaging 100, which is more than our in person attendance. Chris said our Facebook looks really good. The council accepted the report as presented.

#### **CORE TEAM REPORTS**

Education: Heidi Wierzowiecki. The Christmas Youth Pageant is coming up in December. Our youth Sunday School Class will start up in January.

Fellowship: Dorothy St. Germain. -There is a sign-up sheet for the Thanksgiving Dinner to be held on Sunday November 21, 2021. Everything is coming together just fine.

Service and Justice: Marie Williams. About two hundred ninetysix dollar was raised for Good Gifts. Volunteers are still needed to work the Soup Kitchen on the third Friday each month. The Christmas tree will be put up this year.

Worship: Bee Rose. Absent.

Evangelism: Ann Helm. The "Halloween Truck & Treat" event held on October 30, 2021 she felt was a big success. Four Hundred pieces of candy was given out with a message, "Jesus loves them" and inviting them to church. Church members dressed up. It was a lot of fun, but it took a lot of work. The next event is planned for April.

#### **PASTOR'S REPORT:**

Pastor had five in Person, Zoom and Facebook Sunday Worship Services. Eight people received Communion at Nursing Home Communion. Fourteen office visits. Three Sunday Adult Bible Studies on the Book of Philippians. This Sunday will be last Sunday Adult Bible Study. We will take a week off. Then resume with a study of Luke. Worship Hymns were selected up to April 03, 2022. Four Internship Supervision meetings. Pastor attended the Faithful Innovation Meeting, October 14, the COW Conference Meeting via Zoom October 16, the Pericope Study with the Southeastern Synod, October 18, the NT-NL Briarwood Leadership Convocation on Zoom, October 18-20 and the Synod Event, "Leading for God's Future", October 21, 2021. He attended the Trunk and Treat on October 30, 2021. Reformation Sunday was October 31<sup>st</sup>, 2021. The Texas-Oklahoma Intern Cluster, Zoom event on November 04<sup>th</sup>. He attended two "Leading for God's Future events, but one was canceled. All Saints Sunday was November 7. 2021. Coming events; First Communion Class date is yet to be determined. Intern Ann will lead a class here and one in Miles. Pastor will join her in the classes. Tomorrow will be a busy day for meetings. Pericope Study with Southeastern Synod, the 75<sup>th</sup> Church Anniversary Meeting and Faithful Innovation Meeting are scheduled for November 09. Leading for God's Future Zoom meeting will be on November 12 and November 18<sup>th</sup>. Men's breakfast bible study will be on November 13, 2021. The Semi-Annual Congregation Meeting is scheduled for November 14, 2021. Our Thanksgiving Meal is scheduled for November 21, 2021. Mid-Week Advent Services begin Decembers 1<sup>st</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup>, and 22<sup>nd</sup> at 6pm. Christmas Youth Pageant will lead the December 12 service, The Council's Christmas Meal is December 13th. Christmas Eve Service is December 24, at 7pm. The Epiphany Potato Luncheon is scheduled for January 08. Ash Wednesday will be March 02, 2022. Pastor will be on vacation January 04<sup>th</sup> - January 06, 2021. May 15th-May21<sup>st</sup>, 2022. Pulpit Supply needed for May 15, 2022. Pastor will be on vacation June 09 -June 22, 2023. Pulpit Supply needed. Calvary's 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration is scheduled for October 16, 2022. Pastor will be on vacation June 11, 2023 and June 18, 2023.

The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.

I received an article from a friend recently that grabbed my attention. The article reflects a conversation between two women. The first paragraph probably draws a chuckle from women and a sneer from men. As a woman, I could see the humor. I thoroughly enjoyed the next paragraph which presents examples of God's coming to women wherever they are in every sort of work they were doing. I'm sure that God comes to men, as well as women, although where He finds them may be very different. In today's world, who changes the diaper and who changes the oil under the car? It could be either the man or the woman or both. That doesn't really matter and misses the point Heather is making. God comes to each of us wherever we are.

#### Article from Heather F:

I was talking to a friend the other day, saying that as a modern woman I feel like I'm never *free* enough from my responsibilities, never in a *quiet* enough space I want to communicate with God. Her response floored me, 'That is why God comes to women. Men have to climb the mountain to meet God, but God comes to women whereever they are.'

I have pondered on this for weeks and have searched my scriptures to see that what she said is true. God does indeed come to women where they are, when they are doing their ordinary, everyday work. He meets them at the wells where they draw water for their families, in their homes, in their kitchens, in their gardens. He comes to them as they sit beside sickbeds, as they give birth, care for the elderly, and perform necessary mourning and burial rites. Even at the empty tomb, Mary was the first to witness Christ's resurrection. She was there because she was doing the womanly chore of properly preparing Christ's body for burial.

In these seemingly mundane and ordinary tasks, these women of the scriptures found themselves face to face with divinity.

He lives. And he's using a time such as this to speak to women around the world."

## Evangelism Continued

How can we use Heather's message to help us share the good news?

- Recognize that God comes to us wherever we are.
- Pray for God, through the Holy Spirit, to guide us in our ordinary daily lives doing ordinary work.
- Accept the Holy Spirit's presence within us and be strengthened by His power. Engage in conversation with the Holy Spirit often throughout each day. He will guide us.
- 4. Allow the Holy Spirit to grow within us until we begin to feel love of our neighbor and joy in the Lord, knowing we are His children, and then pour that love and joy into our everyday work. Love and joy keep growing we feel a strong desire to share those feelings with others. Our work will become different, perhaps easier in some ways, but certainly more satisfying as we work together with the Holy Spirit. God's work. Our hands.
- 5. Allow the Holy Spirit to make our joy visible to others. Even if we try to hide our joy, our light will shine through! Others will see God at work in us. In John 13:35 we learn from Jesus Christ that our love for others will show that we are His disciples.

A familiar song proclaims, "They will know we are Christians by our love!" When we reflect love and joy, people around us become more receptive to hearing what we share about God's love for us. Now the Holy Spirit has a seed to work with.

- 6. Make ourselves available to the Holy Spirit so that He can work through us to reach those who need to hear how much God loves them. Say "yes" to His call with joy and a willing heart! It should be a joy to share how much God loves us at this point, because we know what that means in every aspect of our lives. We are joyfully filled with His love to overfill. It has to be shared.
- 7. Allow the Holy Spirit to bring people across our path. We don't know when or where this may happen, or under what circumstances, but we know people will cross our paths. I can't begin to describe all the different situations in which the Holy Spirit can work through. But I can say that sharing the good news is only possible because God comes to each of us first, wherever we are and in whatever we are doing.



In the meantime, we can live boldly into Paul's vision as we gather in our communities of faith. In gathering at the foot of the cross with our many and diverse gifts, we find our common bond. It is at Christ's table, where words and bread are brought together, that we are enlivened and our muscles flexed for ministry. This wonderful "being together, but not the same" makes us the body of Christ.


