
# Calvary Comment

#### From the Pastor:

<sup>13</sup>No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. John 15:13

Valentine's Day, Thursday, February 14th, is quickly approaching. Have you given any thought to what you might do or say to express your love for that special person in your life? If not, perhaps John (the Disciple whom Jesus loved) can provide some insight into the true nature of love. St. John is often called the

Apostle of Love. Both his Gospel and his Epistles are filled with references to God's love for mankind and our loving response to the love God has shown to us through His Son.

In the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5:43, 44), Jesus sets a very high standard for love. He directs us to love not only those who love us, but also to love our enemies and those who persecute us. That is a rather tall order. But that is nothing compared to the standard Jesus sets in John's Gospel when Jesus declares, "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you." In John 15:12, Jesus goes on to describe the very nature of perfect, selfless love "Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends." John 15:13

And that is exactly what Jesus did for us; He laid down His life in order to save us. God's love for humankind was made manifest in the incarnation of Christ and was demonstrated in the cross. Jesus' perfect, selfless, sacrificial love for us sets a higher standard for love than has ever been set before. It is a standard we cannot hope to meet. Because of our sinful nature we cannot hope to love even ourselves as completely as Christ loves us. But that does not mean we should give up and stop trying to love others as ourselves. As those who by faith are united with Christ, His great love for us enables and empowers us to acts of service and love towards others, especially our brothers and sisters in the church. John captures the very essence of Christ's love at work in our lives in the fourth chapter of his first letter.

<sup>7</sup>Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. <sup>8</sup>Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. <sup>9</sup>God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent His only Son into the world so that we might live through Him. <sup>10</sup>In this is love, not that we loved God but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. <sup>11</sup>Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another. 1 John 4:7-11

As St. Valentine's Day approaches, I commend to your reading the entirety of St. John's first letter. It is filled with encouragement for your daily life that is firmly grounded in God's love for you that is found in Christ Jesus alone. May the love of Christ be with you. See You In Church.

### **Council's Corner**

### Calvary Lutheran Church Council Meeting 12 November 2018

The meeting was called to order at 6:38 p.m. on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2018, by the Council President Fritz Leifeste. Pastor Paul Zwarich offered a devotional based on the verse John 3:16, and a prayer.

MEMBERS PRESENT: Fritz Leifeste, Chris Kinsey, John Ulrich, Joyce O'Connell, Marie Williams, Betty Thane, Barbara Walker, Pastor Paul Zwarich, Dorothy St. Germain and James Parry. Lou St. Germain and Leon Thane also attended.

MINUTES: John Ulrich motioned, seconded by Marie Williams, that the minutes of the 8 October Council Meeting be accepted as presented. The motion passed.

TREASURER'S REPORT: John Ulrich presented a printed report of Calvary Lutheran Church's financial condition as of 31 October 2018. No exceptions were noted, and the report was accepted by the Council.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT: Joyce O'Connell presented her report in a new format which showed the weekly offerings, the average monthly offerings, and the attendance totals. The report will be generated weekly and summarized annually.

#### CORE TEAM REPORTS:

Education – Marie Williams reported that the Sunday School averages 6 students, and the confirmation/adult class averages 15 members. The Sunday School classes will not meet during the Christmas holidays because many of the members will be out of town. The Children's Christmas program will take place during the Sunday service on 16 December. The Day Camp 2019 is scheduled for either the second or fourth week in June. If these dates are not available with Cross Trails Ministries, the \$500.00 deposit will be refunded. Four counselors will work with about 30 campers.

Fellowship – Betty Thane reported for Kara Martinez that a Breakfast Potluck will be held on 30 December during the Sunday School hour at 8:45 a.m.

Service and Justice – Betty Thane reported that the Good Gifts Project, (AKA-The Noisy Bucket Offering) had collected \$873.62 since September 2017. At the annual meeting on 18 November, the congregation will be able to vote on where the money will be donated, i.e. share of a water well, goat, cow, or a share of a cow. The Good Gifts Christmas Tree will be in the narthex between 2 December and 30 December.

Worship – Dorothy St. Germain reported that Barbara Montgomery has agreed to play for the Christmas Eve Service and others during the coming month. Several individuals have expressed interest in playing, but not on a full-time basis. ASU student Grace Allen applied for the position as a pianist and will play for the 9 December service. The congregation will be able to give feedback to the search committee and council in making a decision to hire her. Advent Services will begin Wednesday, 28 November at 6:00 p.m. The Christmas Eve Service will be held at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, 24 December.

Evangelism – Barbara Walker reported that the "Come And See" reception on Sunday, 4 November, was a successful event. The discussion topic was about sharing the word about Calvary and building relationships with others in the community in our daily lives. Bookmarks and business cards are available for those willing to have them and to share them with others.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Paul Zwarich gave a detailed report on his many official duties and scheduled meetings. He will be required to attend a "Pastor at Boundaries" training meeting at Briarwood on 17 January. This training is required on a regular basis by the Synod and the church's insurance coverage. He noted that Joyce O'Connell had taken a beautiful picture of the confirmation class which also included Bishop Erik Gronberg and himself. The picture will be framed and placed in the narthex.

OLD BUSINESS: The Council discussed having a Dinner Meeting in place of the December Council Meeting. The agenda for the 18 November Congregational Meeting was finalized. Two delegates to the Synod Assembly next April need to be selected.

NEW BUSINESS: The Council members were reminded that the various core teams should have a short report of their activities for inclusion in the Annual Report of the Church by 1 February, 2019. The council had received "Thank You" notes from Meals for the Elderly and Wesley Trinity Daily Bread Program for our donations of \$62.50 each.

CLOSING: There being no further business, the meeting was duly closed at 7:23 p.m. in peace and harmony with the Lord's Prayer.

It was so nice to have all my family around the table at this time. After much eating and visiting, all departed for their home except my daughter, Teresa, who stayed until after my surgery and then flew home to her family.

My surgery went just fine, as the Dr. had planned for it to. I was in Shannon Hospital until December 2, when I was transferred to Senior Care Meadowcreek, where I stayed until discharged on December 14.

I want to sincerely thank those of you who came to visit me while in Meadowcreek. Pam and John came each Sunday, and Pam came sometimes during the week. Also visiting me while in Meadowcreek were Margaret and Fritz Leifeste, Karla Hariman, Staci Shoemaker (the ASU student who has been attending church, and who brought me a small Christmas tree and an ASU stuffed tiger), Betty and Leon Thane, Pastor Paul and Phyllis, and Jill. I thoroughly enjoyed each one of your visits.

To all of you who remembered me with a get-well wish or in your prayers, very special thanks to each of you.

My biggest thrill through all of this ordeal is the Christmas caroling that members of Calvary did. To see some youth among you was so very uplifting. Al and I love all the youth of Calvary and the participating that you do at times during worship. The youth is what any church is made of. Keep up the good work, youth.

I am still struggling to get where I should be with my right arm. Someone, somewhere, dropped the ball of my exercises to be done, so therefore I am at least 2 to 3 weeks behind with them. Encompass Home Health was able to come to our home and work with me for a couple weeks, and then had to sign off. I am now going to Therapy Solutions three time a week. I'm thinking this is going to last for 6 weeks.

I will be glad when I can once again return to church to worship with all of you. Al has been able to be faithful in church attendance since the surgery. Till we meet again, God bless each of you. Our love to all, Rosalee and Al King.
