## Council's Corner

### COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES - November 11, 2019

MEMBERS PRESENT: Joyce O'Connell, Fritz Leifeste, Kara Martinez, Betty Thane, Barbara Walker, John Ulrich, and Pastor Paul Zwarich.

President calls meeting to order at 6:40 p.m.

Opening prayer - Pastor shared a devotional and prayer in honor of Veteran's Day.

Review and approve previous month's minutes. Minutes were amended with slight wording change as follows: "Barbara Walker presented two estimates from Bird's Eye Landscape: the traditional landscape idea for \$5250.00 and an estimate for a xeriscape option for \$4,800.00. Chris Kinsey motioned to accept the proposed estimate from Bird's Eye Landscape for the xeriscape option." Joyce motioned to approve minutes as amended, John seconded, motion passed.

Treasurer's report - John presented report - see attached.

Financial Secretary's report – Joyce presented report and noted the increase in attendance and offerings the last month. See attached.

#### Core Team reports

Education – Marie Williams sent her report including minutes from the committee's last meeting. Children's Christmas Play will be on Dec 15 during church. Calendar sales by youth are ongoing. Early planning for camps in 2020 began. See attached.

Fellowship – Kara Martinez reported on recent potluck, September 29. Committee met concerning Thanksgiving meal on November 17. They also are planning a Christmas Brunch for December 29.

Service and Justice – Betty Thane shared a report. Noisy bucket offering total as of October 31 is \$816.38. The group plans to bake cookies for the military in December. Christmas Caroling is planned for December 15 following worship service. 2019 Advent calendars and Good Gifts Christmas Tree will be available Dec 1 in the narthex.

Worship – Teddi Phillips sent in a report. Special music has been performed by LaMont. New members joining and some Baptisms coming up along with 1<sup>st</sup> communions. See attached.

Evangelism – Barbara Walker reported success at the First Saturday at the Chicken Farm giving out 125 bottles of water, 100 balloons, 45 bookmarks, and 15 brochures. We purchased an ad to be included in Playbill for 2019-20 season at San Angelo Broadway Academy Youth Theatre. She is starting an Online Bible Study and is inviting everyone to join in.

Pastor's report — Pastor presented a report and noted Curt, Julie, Ellie, and Hudson Storey have requested to be removed from membership at Calvary Lutheran Church. (See note attached.) Three students recently completed Acolyte training. We have 8 new members joining including Frances "Bee" Rose, William "Hank" Rose, Jill Zuehlke, Mark Richard Mitchell, and Robert & Heidi Wierzowiecki and their two children. We plan to have a New Member Sunday and Reception on December 1. See report attached.

#### **Old Business**

Lawn landscaping update – Barbara reported there is a problem converting existing sprinkler system to drip so we will need to add drip system to faucet (with a timer). Brent at Bird's Eye said he estimates no more than \$1,000 additional funds will be needed to cover tree trimming, repairing sprinkler system, and adding drip system. He provided two sample designs to use on the bench he is donating. Everyone agreed the simple design with church name and crosses would look better.

Kitchen update – John reported the new dishwashers have been installed. He is working with Lowes to have the new countertops installed soon.

Church Directory update - Joyce shared a sample of what the new ACS software will provide.

Church sign update - John said the sign is ordered and should be here by Christmas. Donated funds will pay for the sign.

ACS Software update – Joyce reported the information has been converted from our old system into ACS. Currently learning the new system.

#### **New Business**

December Council Meeting – We plan to have dinner at Twin Mountain Steak House for our December meeting on Dec 9. New Member Sunday and Meal with Council—We hope to celebrate with new members on Sunday, December 1 and go to Zentner's Daughter for lunch after church.
