She also mentioned the Good Gifts Christmas Tree will be put in the Narthex by November 29<sup>th</sup>. She said different options are being looked at in order to help people participate by making an arrangement to pick up an ornament without having to actually be in the church.

Worship: Bee Rose. Nothing new to report. However, she wanted to thank everyone who has helped with the services. Either by zoom or in person. "Thank you for all your support".

Evangelism: Barbara Walker Nothing new to report.

#### Pastor's Report:

Pastor went over his pastoral acts. Three Inperson Sunday Worship Services. Four Zoom Sunday Worship Services. One Worship Service in Miles. Nine Office Visits. Two new members were received on Reformation Sunday - Lori Smithwick and Elaine Welty. The meetings he attended were; A Zoom Dean Meeting with the Bishop. A Dean Meeting with COW Pastors. One two day continuing Education Event - Bishop Convocation October 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> of 2020. One office Visit with a COW Pastor. One Council Meeting in Miles. The activities he conducted were; Three Adult Bible Studies per Zoom on Tuesday Evenings. Three Confirmation Zoom Lessons. They completed the study of the "Lord's Prayer". Confirmation will resume in January. Upcoming Coming Events are; The Semi-Annual / Annual Congregation Meeting on November 15, 2020. Advent Starts November 29, 2020. Mid-Week Services will be determined. As well as determining if or when to decorate the Church for Advent/Christmas Season and the December Council Meal/Meeting and Christmas Caroling. Christmas Eve Service starts at Seven o'clock that evening. Pastor will be out of the office January 04<sup>th</sup> – January 07<sup>th</sup>, 2021. The Epiphany Potato Meal held in January is to be determined. The COW Conference Meeting is scheduled in Abilene on February 13, 2020. Ash Wednesday is scheduled for February 17, 2021. Easter Sunday is April 04<sup>th</sup>, 2021. The 2021 Synod Assembly is April 23 - April 24, 2021. Location is to be determined. Confirmation (Pentecost Sunday) will be Sunday May 23, 2021. Pastor will be on vacation September 25 – October 03, 2021. Pulpit Supply will be needed for Sunday September 26 and October 03, 2021. Pastor will also be on vacation May 15, 2021 - May 21, 2021. Pulpit Supply will be needed for Sunday May 15, 2021. Calvary's Seventy-fifth Anniversary Celebration Sunday will be on October 16, 2022.

#### **Old Business**


Fritz said the two delegates will need to be selected during the upcoming congregational meeting that will attend the Synod Assembly in April. Pastor and Fritz recommended that we hold off on the "All Committee Night", until we see what happens with the COVID -19 numbers.

#### New Business

Pastor said during Advent everyone will receive "Devotional for Advent" a book in anticipation we may not be able to meet. It's a daily devotional that can be read throughout the Advent Season. Typically, a Wednesday Mid-Week Advent Service is held. It was recommended that a Zoom Mid-Week Advent Service be held at 6pm every Wednesday during Advent, which starts on November 29<sup>th</sup>. The council agreed. Pastor said normally we gather after a service and decorate the church for the Christmas Season. However, this year we believe only four or five members should get to together on a Saturday to decorate the church. That way it limits the number of people there at one time. The Altar Guild will make the arrangements to decorate the church for Christmas and Thanksgiving. The youth Christmas program is canceled this year. The Caroling is canceled this year as well. The December Council Meeting Meal is tentatively scheduled for the same place we went last year. In person and Zoom Christmas Eve Service is still scheduled for seven o'clock with social distancing in place. The January 09<sup>th</sup> Epiphany Potato Meal will be planned as scheduled, per the Altar Guild. However, if necessary it can be canceled. John said if we decided to close the church for in person services, "Should we allow the outside group, AA, to meet in the church"? The council said it would be fine for them to meet in the church as long as social distance guidelines are followed. The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.

ASK: The Third Prayer

In the last two

devotionals we discovered that praise and repentance are the first two steps to effective prayer. Today I want to show you the very important third step of asking.

Last time we talked about how repentance is searching your own heart and asking God to put the spotlight on it, and then repenting of anything that He shows you. When your heart is clean, you can have confidence before God when you ask. As 1 John 3:21-22 says,

"Beloved, if our heart does not condemn us, we have confidence toward God. And whatever we ask we receive from Him, because we keep His commandments and do those things that are pleasing in His sight."

In Matthew 7:7-11, Jesus tells us,

"Ask, and it will be given to you; Step in Effective seek, and you will find; knock, and it condemn us, we have confidence will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives, and he who seeks finds, and to him who knocks it will be opened. Or what man is there among you who, if his son asks for bread, will give him a stone? Or if he asks for a fish, will he give him a serpent? If you then, being evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask Him!" Matthew 7:7-11 NIV

> Pretty clear, isn't it? God loves you and wants the very best for you. Be careful not to water down the words of Jesus, or somehow try and explain them away or complicate them. He meant just what He said.

But there are some conditions. And next time we will look at those conditions for receiving what you ask God for.
