Pastor's Report:

Pastor said things are opening now. He made a hospital visit, a couple of home visits and had a lot of office visits. Meetings are picking up. Blessing & Sending of Interns was on April 14th. He attended one Synod Dean meeting with the council. The Synod Assembly was held. This past week there was a council President, Vice-President and Pastor meeting. The adult bible study was completed and it will resume soon. Confirmation was completed. Pastor took three days of vacation in April. The Congregation Church Meeting is scheduled for this Sunday May 16, 2021. On June 20th, Pastor will be in Miles to install the new intern Ann Williams. He's asked Joyce to lead worship service that Sunday and will get permission from the Bishop for Joyce to preside over communion. Miles extended an invitation for us to come celebrate with them on that day also. On May 23rd the Bishop will be here. Cow Conference is scheduled for June 12. It will be Zoom only. Pastor feels the summer picnic suggested for July is a possibility. The Synod wants to have a gathering to gather as a Synod Event. This would gather many different congregations together on September 11, 2021 held at Briarwood. Pastor said he will be there attending the Synod Council Meeting. The next day, is September 12, 2021 which is God's Work Our Hands so we will plan for that. Pastor didn't have a lot of information on the NT-NL Briarwood Leadership Convention scheduled for October 18-20, 2021 yet. That concluded his report.

Old Business

Live Streaming to Facebook went live last Sunday and there has been a lot of good feedback. Pastor suggested adding a few more mics to pick up the congregation singing. Chris wanted us to know that live mics will pick up background conversations during the worship service so the congregation needs to be made aware so they can be mindful of what they say. The congregation meeting will not be streamed but it will be recorded.

New Business

A Faithful Innovations promotional material handout was given to the council for discussion. This will be a topic for discussion at the Cow Conference on June 12. The Synod has ask for a team of four to seven people to receive training over a twelve month period. Titled "Listen, Act and Share". Pastor suggested opening the training to members of the congregation who might be interested as well. It would be good for those individuals to attend the Cow Conference Meeting on June 12. Pastor thought we would set a good example to the conference by attending the training. The individuals going through the training would share what they are learning. Pastor said there will be an information session on June 12. Marie said there isn't any new nominees yet to fill the council president's position. Heidi Wierzowiecki said she would be a representative for education on the council. Linda Ortegon volunteer to run again for secretary. Ann Helm said the NT-NL is hosting a workshop on racism. She thought it would an opportunity for us to learn. NT-NL will be

providing the information. Ann thought it would be a good awareness opportunity. The Pastor wanted to share this information with the council since it was going to be in the newsletter. Ann said she would attend and give the council feedback. Pastor said since we never had an all committee night, he thought we could coordinate that event with another event soon. Pastor thought with a few positive changes we could peak more interest. Pastor would like us to start planning the all committee night and carry the discussion forward to the next meeting. John ask the council to approve a three percent pay raise for the pastor and a one dollar per hour raise for the church secretary. Chris motioned to accept. Marie moved to accept. Joyce second the motion. The council accepted. The council ask to add the pay raises and the information on Live Streaming to Facebook to the congregational minutes. Pastor ask the council to approve Joseph Phillips third person to receive confirmation on Confirmation Sunday along with Riley Scott and Anastazja Wierzowiecki. Dorothy moved to accept Joseph to receive confirmation. Marie second the motion. The council approved the motion. This coming Sunday is Chris, Mitch, Annalise and Landon's last Sunday with us. Chris is being reassigned to a base in North Dakota. Pastor will have a God Speed Sending for them. The council thought it would be best to leave the tape up separating the pews for now.

Also, I will be out of town from June 23rd -July 8th. I'm still available by phone and email if anyone needs me.


In closing,

Greetings everyone,

Just like you, I visit the hardware store whenever I need to build or plant something or fix something. My experiences are usually positive and successful, but not always. It depends so much on the help I get from people in the store. Recently, I went looking for a replacement bulb with the old bulb in a sack. When I enter the store I start my journey to find just the right bulb. An inexperienced employee greets me with a smile and tells me the Aisle number and points me to it. I go to the correct aisle and feel immediately overwhelmed by WTMC, way too many choices. Is it just me or are there really thousands of different bulbs to choose from? Another employee walks by and I show him my bulb. He leads me to the area where I can find what I need and leaves me to consider my choices. I'm still staring at many choices matching my bulb, not really understanding which to choose, when a young man walks by me. About 30 seconds later he



walks back and asks if I need help. He is not an employee, mind you, but he offers to help! He looks at my bulb and asks me questions about where I was going to use the bulb. He then begins explaining the different choices and their advantages. I learned about wattage and lumens, etc. and together we selected the best bulb, which, by the way, turned out to be *different and better* than the bulb in my sack. What a blessing this young man was to me that day! I could see Christ working through him.

This experience made me think about my interaction with people and how I can be effective in spreading the Good News. Smiles are always good. A smile with a blessing may be better. Asking someone how they are doing, listening to their answer and offering to pray for them if they are troubled may be even better. An invitation to visit my church is good. An offer to bring someone to church with me might be better. Asking someone if they need help, helping them first, getting to know them first, and then sharing my faith works best for me. As they say these days, "it gives me cred".

We know that Jesus came to teach and bring us to salvation through his death and resurrection. He made many believers through helping and healing them first. So did the apostles. So can we, each in our own way.


