On the Day of Pentecost, 50 days after the Resurrection of our Lord and Savior, the Holy Spirit was poured out upon the followers of Jesus. Jesus had conquered death by rising from the dead and had ascended into Heaven and now the promised Holy Spirit came upon them with power to send the first Christians out in the world to make new disciples. Earlier Jesus

instructed His followers with these words... "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." Acts 1:8



And we, too, have been told to go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and to teach them everything that Jesus has commanded. **Come and Celebrate with us on June 9, 2019,** as we rejoice in the promises of God fulfilled. *Alleluia! Council's Corner

Calvary Lutheran Church Council Meeting 8 April 2019

The meeting was called to order at 6:36 p.m. on the 8th day of April, 2019, by the Council President Fritz Leifeste. Pastor Paul Zwarich offered a devotional entitled "He Who Has An Ear, Let Him Hear" and a prayer.

MEMBERS PRESENT: Pastor Paul Zwarich, Fritz Leifeste, Marie Williams, Kara Martinez, Betty Thane, Dorothy St. Germain, Barbara Walker, John Ulrich, Joyce O'Connell, and James Parry.

MINUTES: Joyce O'Connell motioned, seconded by Kara Martinez, that the minutes of the 11 March, 2019 Council Meeting be approved as corrected and amended. The motion passed.

TREASURER'S REPORT: John Ulrich presented a printed Treasurer's report as of 31 March, 2019. As no exceptions were taken, the report was accepted by the Council.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT: Joyce O'Connell presented the Financial Secretary's report. The report shows the attendance and offerings on a weekly basis and the monthly averages on a yearly basis.

CORE TEAM REPORTS:

Education – Marie Williams presented a detailed written report of the scheduled activities and plans for the coming months. The Sunday School classes will continue until 19 May, 2019. The Summer Camp program will be conducted on 23 – 28 June with the help of Camp Chrysalis counselors. Joyce O'Connell motioned, seconded by Kara Martinez, to authorize Marie Williams to sign an agreement with the College Hills Swim and Racquet Club for use of their pool for one of the activities. The motion passed. Next year's Sunday School program is scheduled to begin on Rally Day, the 25th of August.

Fellowship – Kara Martinez reported on the many activities planned for the summer months and the upcoming Easter period. Easter Sunday will be very busy with a Sunrise Service at 7:30, followed by snacks for breakfast, the regular Easter Service at 10:00, and a potluck meal to follow.

Service and Justice – Betty Thane reported that the Noisy Bucket Offering on the 24th of March collected \$81.83. This brought the yearly total to \$224.44 for the Good Gifts Program. Offerings received at the Mid-Week Lent Services will be donated to Habitat For Humanity. We have received Thank You letters for our donations to the ELCA Good Gifts program, Ronald McDonald House, ELCA World Hunger, and Mosaic of San Angelo for gifts they have received from Calvary.

Worship – Dorothy St. Germain reported that the Worship Team will meet on 11 April to select hymns for the next three months. The upcoming Easter services will include waving of palm branches on Palm Sunday, stripping the altar of linens and service items, and draping a black shroud over the cross on Maundy Thursday until the Easter Sunday morning celebration.

Evangelism – Barbara Walker reported on the upcoming Children's Fair. The plans were to hand out free small bottles of water and free balloons with the Church's name on them. However, the helium is now so expensive that we are looking at alternative ways to share the balloons.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Paul Zwarich's report listed the many distributions of Holy Communion to members in their homes and the nursing home as well as committee meetings. The report also listed the many activities and events scheduled for the next few months. Among these include all of the Easter services, the Synod Mission Assembly, and the confirmation celebration/congregation picnic on the 9th of June.

OLD BUSINESS: John Ulrich reported that the church had received a new Hustler Raptor Zero-turn lawn mower with a 52-inch deck. This unit will replace the unrepairable mower we had been using. Because the oak leaves were still falling, the Council decided to wait until early May to have the gutters cleaned. The up-grade and remodeling of the kitchen was discussed. Fritz Leifeste will head up the committee consisting of Pam Ulrich, Dorothy St. Germain, Kara Martinez, and Betty Thane to research and recommend the equipment for the kitchen project. Joyce O'Connell motioned, seconded by Kara Martinez, that Shannon Carpenter, LLC, dba Classy Cleaning, be selected to do a professional cleaning of the church for \$300.00. The motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS: The Council discussed the upcoming election of Council Members. Several members who have completed a two-year term agreed to continue for another term. A replacement for the Council Secretary will be needed because of the four-year limitation on the Council. Marie Williams motioned, seconded by Barbara Walker, that the Annual May Congregational Meeting be moved to 19 May to avoid conflicting with Mother's Day on 12 May. The motion passed. Betty Thane requested permission to donate three new sixty-inch round tables to the church. The Council accepted the offer.

CLOSING: There being no further business, the meeting was duly closed at 7:36 p.m. in peace and harmony with the Lord's Prayer.


