From the Pastor

All candidates for ordination are required to complete an internship according to standards set by this church and outlined in ELCA/ELCIC Internship Standards and Guidelines adopted in 1992.

Internship is an educational program of the ELCA for candidates preparing for the ordained ministry in the ELCA. The program provides for extended and thorough involvement in the work of ministry. Normally serving in a congregation of this church, the intern is supervised jointly by a pastor and the seminary in co-operation with members of congregations, other pastors, and other interns. Through the internship the candidate engages in the full range of ministerial work and is guided simultaneously in developing attitudes, understandings, and skills vital to the pastoral office. On June 20, 2021, a Service of Beginning will be held at Trinity Lutheran Church in Miles at 10:00 a.m. Normally I do not encourage the congregation to attend a worship service Sunday morning at another congregation, but I would like to invite you to attend the Service of Beginning in Miles as Trinity Lutheran Church and Calvary Lutheran Church welcome the intern to our community.

We will have our normal worship service at Calvary Lutheran Church at 10 am also.

As the internship year progresses, we will keep you informed of the exciting ministry and opportunities God is developing and leading us into in the Concho Valley.

MINUTES: Fritz motion to accept the March 08, 2021 Calvary Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes. Pastor Paul requested a statement be placed in the minutes acknowledging a correction to the minutes in the last newsletter was made. The reference to the new presiding Bishop was in error. It was corrected to the presiding Bishop. The word new was removed. John moved to accept the minutes. Bee second the motion. The council approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT: John Ulrich. The March 2021 Treasurer's Report was approved as presented. John said overall we are looking good.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT: Joyce O'Connell. The Financial report was approved as reported. Joyce said the March average is much better than January and February, so things are looking up.

No food will be served at the confirmation in May due to social distancing guidelines the church still has in place.

Service and Justice: Marie Williams. Marie ask when we could start having meetings with our committees

in person. Pastor said she could schedule them to meet in person now.

Worship: Bee Rose. Fritz shared this information with Bee. Each delegate that will be attending the Synod Conference per Zoom was given their own unique sign on Id. Pastor Paul said the worship committee selected hymns through July. Bee and the Pastor will meet with Pam this coming Friday in order to coordinate activities.

Evangelism: Ann Helm. Ann and John have been updating the church website with little changes each day. The biggest change is on the Pastor's Corner. A link to Bible Studies has been added. As it gets developed she will be adding information that relates to those.

Next week Joyce plans to meet with Chris on the features within Facebook, then meet with Ann. Ann would like to incorporate The Bible App "YouVerse" in an organized manner. She suggested assigning months. January and February would be Evangelism, March and April would be an Easter Theme, May and June would be Service and Justice, July and August would be Fellowship, September and October would be Worship, November and December would be open for Thanksgiving and advent themes. Team members would come up with those themes. Ann ask the members if they would like to start having the children's message again during Sunday Worship Services. She suggested rotating it between team leaders and members of the congregation with a signup sheet. Marie offered to provide the material for those messages. Ann said the children's message would only be given if children were there. Bee ask if children watched per zoom? Bee said a lot of people like to hear the children's message. John suggested we wait a month then address it again. The council agreed. Ann reminded us that San Angelo Gives was coming up.

Something to think about:

In this age of social media and technology, not only to see what your family and friends are doing but watching videos on all sorts of topics (I like the recipes) like sports plays, new song releases, funny animal videos, etc. There are unfortunately, also people out there that don't necessarily have your best interests at heart. I want to talk about those people who prey on Christians. It's in our nature to want to believe someone who sounds like they are talking

or prophesying, especially if they are saying things we want to hear. Towards that end, in my devotional meanderings I found at least one person's litmus test for what may be

1. Does the revelation edify, exhort, or comfort?

2. Is it in agreement with God's written Word?

3. Does it exalt Jesus Christ?

4. Does it bear good fruit? Does the character of the prophet bear good fruit?

5. If it predicts a future event, does it come to pass?

6. Does the prophetic word turn people toward God or away from Him?

7. Does it produce liberty or bondage?

8. Does it produce life, or bring death?

9. Does the Holy Spirit bear witness that it is true?

In keeping with numbers, here is a little arithmetic for you.

To believe in Jesus requires: knowledge + conviction + trust. All of these things together = faith.

Lastly, (should you decide to do it) think of something you do regularly as part of your everyday life. How can you consciously make it an act of worship? Do it for a week and then reflect on your experience. Mine is caring for my plants, what is yours?
