#### From the Pastor:

The Lenten season begins on March 6, 2019 with Ash Wednesday and the imposition of ashes. In the Lutheran church the purpose of the imposition of the ashes is to call to mind the curse given to Adam by God after the Fall in Genesis 3:19, "By the sweat of your face

you shall eat bread, till you return to the ground, for out of it you were taken; for you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

Change. Lent reminds me of change. Just as the curse given to Adam brought change, sin brings changes to our lives today. Change is a constant theme in our lives. Some changes are good and mark gradual transitions, such as when daytime shifts to twilight or when winter turns to spring. Other changes in our lives happen quickly and can turn our lives upside down; like the sudden death of a family member or the loss of employment.


In the weeks leading up to the crucifixion of Christ, the disciples experienced a number of changes that they had not been expecting. On the mountain top Jesus taught His disciples that He must suffer and die, and that if they wanted to be His disciples, then they too must be willing to take up their cross and follow Him. The disciples did not want to hear this. Peter wanted to argue and our Lord rebuked him strongly.

Change is hard. We long for the expected and familiar, but all too often we find ourselves in the midst of uncertainty and the unknown. We want to control our environment, yet too often we find that we cannot even hope to predict how things will turn out.

I invite you to join us for worship each Sunday and on Wednesdays at 6:00 p.m. for worship during the Season of Lent. The word Lent comes from the old English word for "spring." As I once heard it put, Lent is "spring training" for the Christian as we are tutored in repentance, faith, and holy living. Soon our Lenten journey will begin ... change is in the air. Let us pick up our cross and follow Jesus.

## Council's Corner

### Calvary Lutheran Church Council Meeting 14 January 2019

The meeting was called to order at 6:40 p.m. on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of January, 2019, by the Council Vice President Chris Kinsey. Pastor Paul Zwarich offered a devotional entitled "Just This One Time" and a prayer.

MEMBERS PRESENT: Chris Kinsey, John Ulrich, James Parry, Joyce O'Connell, Marie Williams, Kara Martinez, Betty Thane, Dorothy St. Germain, Barbara Walker, Leon Thane, and Pastor Paul Zwarich.

MINUTES: (No official meeting was held in December 2018.) The minutes of the last meeting, held on 12 November 2018, were furnished to the Council. Marie Williams motioned, seconded by John Ulrich, that the minutes be accepted as presented. The motion passed.

TREASURER'S REPORT: John Ulrich presented the Treasurer's report. Although offerings were below the amount budgeted, the financial picture was still looking good for the year. No exceptions were taken to the report.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT: Joyce O'Connell presented the 2018 Annual Summary Report for the congregation's offerings and attendance. This new report format shows the data by weekly, monthly, and annual totals for the offering and attendance.

#### **CORE TEAM REPORT:**

- Education Marie Williams reported that the Elementary Level Class averages four students, the High School Class averages two, and the Confirmation and Adult Class averages 10 per meeting. The Day Camp 2019 is scheduled for the week of 9 14 June, 2019 with 30 campers and four counselors from Cross Trails.
- Fellowship Kara Martinez and Dorothy St. Germain reported that they are still working on a system to determine the actual costs and expenses incurred for the fellowship activities in the church. They are trying to set up a system so the members can report the actual cost of the items they donate to the functions.
- Service and Justice Betty Thane reported that \$980.00 generated by the Noisy Bucket program in 2018 was mailed to the ELCA Good Gifts Program, and \$779.00 generated by the ELCA Good Gifts Christmas Tree Ornaments had been delivered. Marie Williams and Betty Thane have been working on the Crises Information booklets for Calvary. As soon as they are completed, the booklets will be passed out to the members. Gary Griffin has been collecting sleeping bags and blankets for the homeless, as well as toys for underprivileged children during the holiday season.
- Worship Dorothy St. Germain reported that Grace Allen had been hired as the new organist/pianist/keyboardist for Calvary. The hymn selections have been made for February, March, and April.
- Evangelism Barbara Walker suggested the church may hand out small bottles of cool water with the church's name and address on them to persons attending the Children's Fair in Unidad Park.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Paul Zwarich presented a detailed written report of his activities. The 9<sup>th</sup> of June will be a busy Sunday for Calvary. The Bishop's Assistant, Rev. Kris Totzke, will be joining the celebration of the Confirmation Class and the Annual Church Picnic.

NEW BUSINESS: Pastor Paul Zwarich presented the "Congregational Report For The Year Ending December 2018" for the Council to discuss and review. The Council then answered selected portions of the report which described the congregation and its relationship with the community. The 2018 Audit Committee submitted their report of the church's financial records and declared "these records comply with standard accounting procedures." No exceptions or discrepancies were noted.

Marie Williams motioned, seconded by Kara Martinez, that the building custodian's duties be expanded to include outside maintenance as well as inside the building. This would include cleaning the rain gutters and downspouts as well as other mechanical repairs which may come to light. The salary would be increased to \$100.00 per month for this adjustment in the job description. The motion passed.

CLOSING: There being no further business, the meeting was duly closed at 8:18 p.m. in peace and harmony with the Lord's Prayer.


