As Christians we celebrate the Easter Message each Sunday and proclaim the Good News that Jesus Christ has been raised from the dead. And that is why the Easter Greeting is "Alleluia! Christ Is Risen! Christ Is Risen Indeed! Alleluia!

Have you ever noticed that we always use the verb "is" to highlight the present reality of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ? Yes, the Resurrection is an event that happened in the past, but the reality of His Resurrection is ongoing and real to us right now. The Lord Jesus has conquered death and brings us with Him into the victory. You and I are included in the celebration. Our children and their children are also included. The Joy of Easter is Forever. Life with our Lord is forever.

We who have been baptized have been joined to Christ's Death and Resurrection. As Romans 6:3-5 instructs us: "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Jesus Christ were baptized into His death? Therefore, we have been buried with Him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with Him in a death like His, we will certainly be united with Him in a resurrection like His."

I love the last verse in hymn #382 in our Evangelical Lutheran Book of Worship entitled "Christ Is Risen! Alleluia!" which states "Christ is risen! Hence-forth never death or hell shall us enthrall. We are Christ's, in Him forever we have triumphed over all. All the doubting and dejection of our trembling hearts have ceased; hail the day of resurrection! Let us rise and keep the feast."

Council's Corner

Calvary Lutheran Church Council Meeting 11 March 2019

The meeting was called to order at 6:43 p.m. on the 11th day of March, 2019, by the Council President Fritz Leifeste. Pastor Paul Zwarich offered a devotional entitled "Holy Hunger" and a prayer.

MEMBERS PRESENT: Fritz Leifeste, Chris Kinsey, John Ulrich, James Parry, Joyce O'Connell, Kara Martinez, Betty Thane, and Pastor Paul Zwarich.

MINUTES: The minutes of the 11 February, 2019, Council Meeting were furnished to the Council members. John Ulrich motioned, seconded by Joyce O'Connell, that the minutes be accepted as presented. The motion passed.

TREASURER'S REPORT: John Ulrich presented the Treasurer's Report for February 2019. As no questions or exceptions were taken to the report, it was accepted as written.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT: Joyce O'Connell presented a printed report showing the attendance and offerings to the church on a weekly basis for the current calendar year.

CORE TEAM REPORTS:

Education – Marie Williams – No report was given.

Fellowship – Kara Martinez reported that between the Sunrise and Regular Service on Easter morning, plans were to have a brunch of donuts, fruit, coffee, juice, etc. An Easter Potluck Dinner is scheduled after the Regular Service. As the meat will be provided, the members were asked to bring side dishes, cakes, pies, or sweets.

Service and Justice – Betty Thane reported that the Noisy Bucket Program collected \$82.70 for the Good Gifts program. The Lenten Service offerings this year will be donated to Habitat for Humanity. The Ash Wednesday Service collected \$115.00. Ms. Pam Hammer from Habitat for Humanity will give a temple-talk on 24 March.

Worship – Dorothy St. Germain – No report was given.

Evangelism – Barbara Walker mailed a report to the Council members. Her team plans to set up a table at the Children's Fair on 28 April with a banner to identify it as a Calvary Lutheran Church activity. They plan to visit with attendees of the fair and hand out free balloons and small bottles of water with new labels attached to advertise our church.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Paul Zwarich presented a detailed report of his many activities scheduled for this Easter season. Besides the regular Sunday services, there are several church conferences and synod mission assemblies to attend, in addition to the Lenten Mid-Week Services until Easter Sunday on 21 April. The Council also authorized Pastor Zwarich to attend the Rostered Ministers Gathering to be held in Phoenix, AZ, on 20-23 July 2020.

OLD BUSINESS: It was reported that the lawnmower had become unrepairable, and the Council agreed that it was now time to purchase a new one. The church had received a bid of \$500.00 from Harrison Roofing Company to clean out the leaves and trash in the gutters around the church. The debris will be cleaned up and hauled off. The bid was approved.

NEW BUSINESS: The Council discussed having a Spring Clean-Up Day inside and around the church. The options mentioned were to contact a local commercial cleaning company or to set a date and time for church members to meet and handle the project.

CLOSING: There being no further business, the meeting was duly closed at 7:33 p.m. in peace and harmony with the Lord's Prayer.


