Wear Red for Pentecost

May 28th

From the Pastor

On the Day of Pentecost there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And as the disciples spoke in the native language of all who were present that day, the crowd became bewildered, and they kept asking one another "What does this mean?" Acts 2:12

There must have been some Lutherans in the crowd that day because the question "What does this mean?" is straight out of Luther's Small Catechism. Beginning with the First Commandment (You shall have no other gods before me) Luther asks: "What does this mean?" And Luther responds: "We should fear, love, and trust God above all things."

How appropriate that on the Day of Pentecost, God allowed the Good News to be spoken in the native tongue of all that had gathered that day so everyone could ask the question "What does this mean?" And thanks be to God that He directed the wind to blow where He wills, so that the Holy Spirit could answer the question for us.

And what is the answer? The Second Article of the Creed explanation provides the clue. Luther's Small Catechism states: "I believe that Jesus Christ – true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the Virgin Mary – is my Lord.

He has redeemed me, a lost and condemned creature, and has freed me from sin, death, and the power of the devil, not with silver and gold, but with His holy and precious blood and His innocent suffering and death. He has done all this in order that I might be His own, live under Him in His kingdom, and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, even as He is risen from the dead and lives and reigns for all eternity. This is most certainly true."

Yes, Pentecost Sunday is Holy Spirit Day. The day when the question "What does this mean?" is answered. The Day when the answer to Martin Luther's question "What does this mean?" is articulated and spoken in every language under heaven. And what is our response? We respond: "Come Holy Spirit, Come."

Let us pray: God our creator, earth has many languages, but your Gospel announces your love to all nations in one heavenly speech. Make us messengers of the Good News that, through the power of your Spirit, everyone everywhere may unite in one song of praise; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

The Council President Betty Thane called the zoom meeting to order at 6:45 p.m. on the 14th day of March. Pastor Paul gave a devotion. He opened the meeting with a prayer.

MEMBERS PRESENT: Council President Betty Thane, Council Vice President Chris Kinsey, Council Secretary Linda Ortegon, Council Education Council Fellowship Leader Dorothy St. Germain, Council Financial Secretary Leon Thane, Council Treasurer Ann Helm, Council Worship Committee Leader Bee Rose, and Pastor Paul Zwarich. Two Guests Joyce O'Connell and John Ulrich were in attendance.

MINUTES: Betty Thane Council President moved to accept the February 16, 2023, Calvary Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes. Chris motion to accept the minutes. Bee second the motion. The council approved the Calvary Lutheran Church March Council Minutes.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Ann Helm. Ann went over the February 2023 Treasurer's Report. The Council accepted the Treasurer's report as presented.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT: Leon Thane went over the February 2023 Financial Report. The Council accepted the February 2023 Financial Secretary's Report as presented.

New Business

Nominating Committee. Chris volunteered to lead the committee to fill the positions of people moving off the church council. Linda and Bee will help. Betty and Pastor will attend the meeting.

Church Copier. We may need to replace the church copier soon. We will be contacting a couple of companies for their prices.

Online Streaming. Chris said the purpose of the upgrades is to simplify the on-line streaming platform. The upgrade will make it easier for any person to run. Since the MEF Grant was not approved, Chris and John met and prioritized the upgrade. Chris's company will donate the labor. The total price is \$16,402.00 plus the cost of another computer. Betty suggested that we offer to the congregation the means to help with the remaining cost should they choose. Pastor suggested the microphones be replaced at the same time. Chris said there will be at least a four-month lead time to get the material. Chris abstained from voting. Bee motion to move forward with the discussion to use the funds earmark for this type of need to include replacing the microphones. Linda second the motion. Ann went back over the details, which included adding an \$1,000.00 for the new microphones. During the next service announcement, we will let the congregation know of the online streaming need and the funds that are available and the cost left.

If anyone in the congregation would like to help, they can mark their offering envelope appropriately. The council approved using the capitol fund to pay for upgrading our electronic equipment plus the microphones. If anyone has any questions, please contact Chris or John Ulrich.

Briarwood. A letter from the bishop's office was received informing us that the board of directors of Briarwood decided to sell the entire property. The buyer said they will keep the facility open to the public to keep Briarwood's history. The buyer also has the means to spend the millions of dollars necessary to repair the property.

Old Business

Harrison Roofing. Harrison Roofing can set up a yearly schedule with us to clean out the rain gutters. The council agreed to have Harrison Roofing clean the rain gutters once in the spring and once in the fall. Chris motion to accept. Bee second the motion. The council approved.

Utility Report. The city did a lead test and discovered our water lines have lead soldering. However, we do not use

enough drinking water to be concerned. The letter from the City Inspector said our water lines can stay in place. The inspector suggested repair issues be addressed as they occur.

MEF. The Mission Endowment Fund Grant was not approved this year.

Debit and Credit Cards. Ann set a limit of \$500.00 on all the debit cards. Except for the Treasurer's card. The Treasurer will receive alerts on every card transaction.

Correspondence. A Thank You note from Salvation Army was received. A report from Project Dignidad showing donations valued at \$309.00 from December to now were received on behalf of Calvary Lutheran Church.

Annual Report. A financial report was made available to the congregation. Chris will be giving a report on the results of Consecration Sunday.

The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Pray.


