From the PastorLast night as Phyllis and I were watching the nightly news, we both looked at each other and said, "Wow, another night of awful news." Flooding, forest fires, unending war in Ukraine, riots, protests, fluctuating US trade policy, the immigration debate, the list goes on and one. And not even the "feel good" story at the end of the broadcast brought relief from all the negativity and heartache. Right now, it seems, we are living under a dark cloud, and every day it seems to be getting darker.

Have you ever experienced the same thing as you watched the nightly news? Yes, the news can be a bit overwhelming, and awful. And one can be left to wonder if we will ever get out of the dark times that we seem to be living in.

It never ends. And so, the question that needs to be addressed is, "What can we (I) do about it?" I am not talking about protests, or US trade policy, or the war in Ukraine; I am talking about the overall current darkness that is covering our world.

That is a tough question. But the Bible does point us in the right direction. In the beginning, when God created the heavens and the earth, there was also darkness, and God in His infinite wisdom said, "Let there be light. And there was light. And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness." Genesis 1: 3

One of the first acts of creation was to separate light from darkness. And ever since then "The light has shone in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." John 1:5

But that is not all that God did. At the appropriate time, God sent a man named John, to testify to the light, so all might believe through him. John was not the light, instead he was sent to point all of humanity to the true source of light. John 1:6

Today God is sending us out to point to the true source of light so all might put their hope in Him. In Matthew, Jesus tells us "You are the light of the world... Go and let your light so shine before others, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven." Matthew 5:14-16


For spiritual renovations, however, the choice is clear. "God is the builder of everything," says Hebrews 3:4 (NIV). Elliott writes, "Jesus is not only the *builder* of His Father's house, but He is the *buyer*, and the *heir* as well." And what he's building, she adds, is "a better Bride," his church.

Faith upgrades are an ongoing, lifelong process. "The renewal of our natures is a work of great importance," said 18th-century minister George Whitefield. "It is not to be done in a day. We have not only a new house to build up, but an old one to pull down." It's a good thing God oversees this project!
