From the Pastor

The month of March has begun. That means we can look forward to many things. Day Light Savings time will begin on Sunday March 12, the First Day of Spring will occur on Monday March 20, St. Patrick's Day will be celebrated on Friday March 17, and of course March Madness will start on Sunday March 12 and last till the end of the month.

The Month of March also has another event that has been remembered for over 2,000 years. The event is the "Ides of March." On March 15, 44 B.C., Julius Caesar was stabbed to death in the Roman Senate by 60 conspirators led by Marcus Junius Brutus and Gaius Cassius Longinus.

The expression "Beware of the Ides of March" derived from the fact that one month earlier before Julius Caesar was assassinated, he had visited a sooth-sayer named Spurinna who predicted that his life would be in danger for the next 30 days. Hence the term, beware of the "Ides of March."

Now, I know that the "Ides of March" may not mean that much to us today, but the Season of Lent does mean a lot to us. During the Season of Lent, we are invited to spend time reflecting upon the life, teachings, and death of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

During Lent we are encouraged to pray, practice almsgiving, and fast so we can refresh our knowledge of God's great love for us.

And why are we encouraged to do these things? The Prophet Isaiah wrote "We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each one of us has turned to our own way; and the Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all... He poured out His life unto death... For He bore the sins of many, and made intercession for the transgressors." Isaiah 53:6,12

Christ died for our sins. We are justified by His sacrificial death. Unlike Julius Caesar, Jesus did not stay dead in the grave. Jesus said: "I have authority to lay (my life) down and authority to take it up again." John 10:18 Julius Caesar, with all his earthly power and might did not have this authority.

In March, we observe Lent and not the "Ides of March." Through Christ we receive the forgiveness of sin, the resurrection of the body, and the gift of life everlasting.

Worship

We're definitely moving closer to Spring if this weather is any indication! And, Spring brings Lent. Here's something to consider. We usually think of Lent as a time to give something up or deprive ourselves of. But I've had some discussions that provide other ideas. The object is to bring yourself closer to God, to give yourself time for reflection and introspection. Toward that end, things you can do besides giving up a favorite food or drink are: 1. Start walking so you can have time for talking to God and/or listening for Him. 2. Take some time out of your day (10-15 min) to just sit with God without external distractions. 3. Start doing devotional plans. The point is, it doesn't matter what you do as long as you start something positive that you continue.

Something to ponder:

Colors and Shadows

The colors that we see are actually reflections; that is, our eyes perceive the light that bounces back to us from whatever we are looking at. Not all the light is reflected back to our eye; some is absorbed. The colors we perceive are, in actuality, precisely what they aren't: they are the light that is reflected away.

During a summer making art and talking with residents of Phoebe Ministries, which serves people with dementia, I reflected on color and vision, perception and its limitations.

Sometimes, as we see people growing older, we see them losing qualities and characteristics that we have loved. We may see them as shadows of their former selves. But Paul in 1 Corinthians 13:12 reminds us that we are fully known by God, even as we struggle to know ourselves and each other. We see through a mirror dimly now, Paul writes,

But when we enter life eternal, we will come to know each other as we are fully known by God. (This message is excerpted from "Learning to see God's beloved" by Mary Button in the October 2019 Cafe online magazine.)




