The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. on the 13TH day of September by the Council President Joyce O'Connell. Pastor Paul gave the devotion from Mark 9. Whoever wants to be first must be last. Jesus always called on his followers for always putting themselves first. Jesus wants us to serve others. When we give up pushing other people out of the way we discover that God's grace makes room for us all. Pastor opened with a prayer.

MEMBERS PRESENT: Joyce O'Connell, Ann Helm, Chris Kinsey, Linda Ortegon, Dorothy St. Germain, Leon Thane, John Ulrich, Marie Williams and Pastor Paul Zwarich. Guest: Mark Mitchell.

MINUTES: Joyce motion to accept the August 09, 2021, Calvary Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes. John moved to accept the minutes. Chris second the motion. The council approved the August Calvary Lutheran Church Council Minutes.

TREASURER'S REPORT: John Ulrich. The Treasurer's report was accepted as presented.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT: Leon Thane presented the report for September. The council accepted it as presented.

CORE TEAM REPORTS

Education: Heidi Wierzowiecki. Absent. Per Ann Helm. The Women's Bible Study is being held every Wednesday at 6:00 p.m. in the evening. It has been very well attended.

Fellowship: Dorothy St. Germain. Nothing to Report.

Service and Justice: Marie Williams. Noisy Bucket collection was \$72.70. Last month on the 20th we

helped serve 200 meals with Trinity Lutheran at the Soup Kitchen. We will continue helping this month on the 19th going through the 17th of October. Donations of personal items for the Family Shelter can be brought up to that date. Most families that arrive at the Family Shelter come in with just the clothes they are wearing. The collections can be dropped off at the church.

Worship: Bee Rose Absent.

Evangelism: Ann Helm. An Evangelism meeting was held on the 8th. They got the bulletin board done. They put together visitor bags and three are ready to be given out. They would like to have a "Come and See Event" the last day of October as a Halloween trunk and treat. Invitations will go out to Bowie Elementary. A message that invites them to come to the church will be included in each bag.

Pastor's Report: Pastor had four in Person, Zoom and Facebook Sunday Worship Services. One Funeral at Miles for Naomi Joy Dillion, September 09, 2021. Sixteen people received communion. Seven office visits. Four Sunday Adult Bible Studies on the Book of Philippians. Four Internship Supervision meetings. Pastor attended the "All Committee Gathering" w/ congregation August 14, 2021. Blessing of the backpacks was held on August 15, 2021. Noisy Bucket collection was on August 22, 2021. Evangelism Meeting was held September 08, 2021. The Synod Council Meeting with Deans was held on September 10, 2021. Pastor attended the Gathering Together Event September 11, 2021. He was recognized for his 20th anniversary ordination. Budget Committee Meeting will be held on September 14th, 21st and 28th.

All Saints Sunday is November 7, 2021. Thanksgiving Meal is to be TBD. Mid-Week Advent Services begins Decembers 1st, 8th, 15th, and 22nd. Pastor will be on vacation September 25th-October 03rd, 2021. Pulpit Supply will be needed September 26th and October 03rd. Pastor will be on Vacation May 15th-May21st, 2022. Pulpit Supply needed for May 15, 2022. Calvary's 75th Anniversary Celebration is scheduled for October 16, 2022. Pastor will be on vacation June 09 – June 22, 2023. Pulpit Supply needed.

NEW BUSINESS: On-Line giving. Chris handed out some information that talked about adding a button to our Facebook page live screen and calling it contributions. He wanted to talk to the council about it since it would take a group effort to get working if we chose to proceed. The council like the idea and gave Chris the go ahead. The council was asked to approve the Budget Committee members to be installed: Fritz, John, Leon, Manuel, and Ouida. Pastor Paul and Joyce are non-voting members. Chris moved to accept the members and Marie second the motion. The council approved. The Semi-Annual Congregation meeting will be held November 14, 2021. The pastor will ask the congregation for

delegates to attend the Synod/Mission Assembly. It's an election year of the bishop. Office coverage is needed September 24th – October 05, 2021. John will check the answering machine and emails. Ann the Miles intern will be available to address any emergency. More technical information will be given to the evangelism team. Evangelism Team ask if we should respond to on-line comments? Chris said we need to be very careful and make sure the decision to reply comments is well thought out before making decision to proceed. The evangelism team will submit suggestions to the council for approval at a later date. The 75th anniversary budget. Leon said the budget committee would like input on what the over-all budget should cover. Dorothy said \$200.00 for banner, \$150.00 flowers, \$150.00 table clothes and \$50.00 for miscellaneous. Catering \$2000.00. Total Budget \$2550.00. Pastor suggested the cost of a room for the bishop be added into the cost. Leon will have it added as a line item. The anniversary budget committee will continue to meet and when the budget has been finalized will submit it to the council.

OLD BUSINESS: Rally Day has been postponed. Since the kids are not coming, we will try again in October. A personal invitation will be sent out to the parents of the kids if it's scheduled. Thanksgiving Dinner is scheduled for the November 21, 2021. Donations of clothes, food and school items for Project Dignidad was received in August.

Evangelism

I'm retired now, but like many people I spent most of my working life with my left foot at work and my right foot at home, often with difficulty maintaining balance between the two. Like many of you I was so busy trying to navigate and survive the ever-changing work world and also take care of my family, that my faith was often absent. There was no time for socializing, no water cooler sessions, no faith sharing. I enjoyed what I had learned to do and what I could accomplish, but beyond a paycheck my workdays were tiring and often unrewarding.

I thought back through my life and remembered one particular person that I worked with that was different from other employees, including me. She should have been named Joy, for she had a peace about her, so kind and sweet. Joy was never rattled, never had an unkind word, very dedicated, worked hard. Why was she different? She usually got to work early, like I did, but she didn't rush in like me. Every morning she sat alone in her car for a little while before entering the building. I wondered why and one day I stopped and asked her if she was okay. Joy was not alone in her car, she was praying with the Holy Spirit. Joy told me that her few minutes with the Holy Spirit helped her do her work more meaningfully, more purposefully, more lovingly, throughout the day. She saw the world and everyone in it as a creation of God. She believed her work within the world given through the Holy Spirit was to the glory of God. Perhaps she was following apostle Paul's advice in Corinthians 15:58, "Get on with your work in as much as you know that it is not in vain in the Lord." Each person Joy encountered through her work had a life story and whatever she said or did with each person became part of their story and her own. What if I had listened and taken the examples of Joy and the apostle Paul to heart. My work would have been more meaningful, more purposeful, and more loving. No regrets.

Thinking of my work and spiritual life during those years, I believe I could have found joy in my work and infused my work with Christ's love if I had not worked so hard to separate my faith from my work. What if I had worked with all my heart, **as working for the Lord**. Colossians 3: 23 says "Whatever you do, work at it with

all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters..."⁴

The apostle Paul was an extraordinary minister of the gospel and a great example of ministering in his work. He was a successful tentmaker long before he was dramatically changed forever into a new life in Jesus Christ. As a missionary, Paul could have discontinued his work as a tentmaker and become a fully "donor-supported" missionary, but he didn't. Instead, as he journeyed all over the region to preach about Jesus, he continued working as a tentmaker, alongside other tentmakers. They learned to respect him in his work and he became their friend, teaching them about Jesus as they worked together. In Acts 18 we learn that when Paul went to Corinth, he met Aquila and Priscilla, fellow tentmakers who had fled Rome. He stayed and worked alongside them as he continued his ministry. When Paul left Corinth for Syria, his new friends, Aquila and Priscilla trusted him enough to follow him.

What if we minister through our work like Joy or Paul? What if we pray every morning, asking the Holy Spirit to lead us into opportunities to minister to the people we work with? What if we become the one at work who notices others who are stressed or struggling or upset and we are kind, listening, supportive, and helping where we can? What if we have an opportunity to remind someone that God is our refuge and our strength in times of trouble or tell someone that God loves each of us today and always? I regret not letting the Holy Spirit lead me in my work life for so many years. All that workplace opportunity to share Jesus was wasted.

Like me, you are also doing your life work, whether that is in a job, volunteering, serving God's church, raising children, grandchildren or great-grandchildren or helping your neighbors and friends. I pray for no more regrets in my daily work. I pray for each of us to seek the Holy Spirit every day and allow Him to enter our hearts as we work. I pray His guidance and blessing makes our workdays matter in a spiritual way, full of opportunities to share Jesus's abounding love with people while we work. May our work be **joyful** in the Lord and to his glory. Amen.

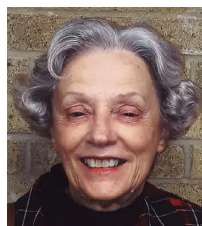

Points to Ponder

Faith May Differ

Your children's and grandchildren's faith does not need to be exactly the same as yours. My husband and I have four grown children and nine grandchildren, and their involvement in their congregations enriches our own faith as we talk about our faith experiences. What a blessing to have a God who is larger than just one denomination.

This excerpt is from "Ten Tips for Grandmas" by Else Shardt in the December 2011 issue of Gather magazine.

Complaining and Grumbling - Numbers 20:1-13

Do you think Moses sometimes felt like a parent trying to herd a pack of squabbling children (the Israelites)? One of parenting's greatest challenges is to lead and discipline without giving in to frustration or anger. Children do not always respond to parental authority in reasonable or obedient ways. Being a good mother or father, teacher or leader, requires God's help!

Moses failed in this area in today's reading. Israel's habitual complaining became a matter of pride. If he took their grumbling personally, he was stepping into the place of God and essentially taking the credit or glory for himself. Normally, he recognized that the people were in fact complaining against God and resisted this temptation.

But not this time. The people were irritable about a lack of water (vv. 2-5). Their constant complaint was, essentially "Why did you bring us here to die?" Moses and Aaron inquired of the Lord, and He told them to speak to a rock and it would pour forth water. Moses, however, spoke and acted in anger, striking the rock instead of speaking to it. Perhaps Moses was depressed about the nation's failure at the border. Perhaps he was upset over the recent death of his sister (v. 1). Whatever the reason, there was no excuse for this sin of pride. "Must we bring you water?" was both a complaint and a boast (v. 10; see Ps. 106:32-33). That's what made his sin of striking the rock so heinous.

Though the punishment of not being permitted to enter the promised land seems severe, it fit the sin (Num. 20:12). Moses had publicly disobeyed the Lord. It was a failure of faith—"you did not trust in me enough"—as well as a failure of obedience and worship. He had failed to honor God as holy.

To us, complaining or grumbling might seem like a mild sin. But Scripture doesn't agree! Let us ask God to help us fight this temptation and "become blameless and pure". (Phil. 2:14-16).

Prayer

In many churches today, reverence is not always emphasized, but we ask You to check our every complaint with a reminder of Your holiness. Silence our complaining with joyful reverence for Your majesty.
