From the Pastor:

Wow. The month of October is upon us, & we are already starting to see the beauty of the fall season. The nights are beginning to get a little cooler. My fall garden is full of tomatoes. Halloween merchandise is in the stores. And believe it or not, I have even seen Christmas merchandise in the stores. Autumn is upon us, & it is indeed a favorite time of the year for many people.

In the Lutheran Church, the month of October concludes with the Festival of the Reformation, the day when we remember Martin Luther's famous posting of his 95 Theses on the doors of the Castle in Wittenberg. The actual date of the posting was on October 31, 1517, on the Eve of All Saints Sunday. Luther chose this date because he knew that there would be a good crowd at church that Sunday to celebrate All Saints Sunday, & that many of his colleagues would be present & notice his "Call for Debate."

Luther posted his 95 Theses in response to many of the false teachings taught in the church at that time, especially the official church teaching on the sale of indulgences. Luther was furious that people were being led astray from the truth of the Gospel & insisted that the people be taught that it is through the grace of God that we are saved & not by our own doing or papal authority. This sparked the beginning of the Reformation, & a return to the Biblical standards of faith & practice.

Today, the Festival of Reformation has largely been overshadowed by Halloween. And so the church, in great wisdom, transferred the celebration of the Reformation to the last Sunday in October, & made Red the color of the Season to remind us of the fire & power of the Holy Spirit, & also to remember the blood of the martyrs who lived before us who gave their lives for the sake of the Gospel.

This year Reformation Sunday will be celebrated on Sunday October 26th. Come & join us as we sing "A Mighty Fortress is Our God," as we recall the day when Martin Luther challenged the Church to restore key biblical doctrines (such as salvation by grace through faith alone) in the church, & his call to the church to return to the Bible as the ultimate authority for our Christian faith.

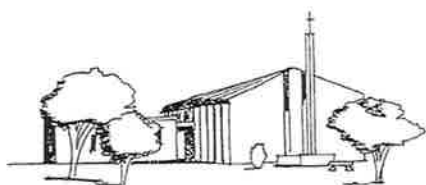
