Here's how it works. Last year during full Quarantine, I moved into my apartment complex. There are lots of single parents, young couples, and widows in my section of 48 apartments. At Christmas, I made cards for each resident and followed up with Valentines. In the Spring I planted a container garden and put out a bird feeder. A fourth grade girl made me a Christmas card and a valentine; 3 and 4 year old's greet me across the courtyard; I have taken one person to work and another to a doctor appointment and prayed with another over a nasty divorce (she brought me a sick plant.) Soon we will be starting a prayer group.

Each of you has been doing this sort of thing for years and probably denying your evangelism. SURPRISE! It's not that hard. Welcome all you evangelists!

Hello from Gary Griffin! Kara Martinez and I have been sharing the "good news" of the gospel through our street ministry in San Angelo for some time. We are part of Calvary's Evangelism Team and have recently been sharing with the Team how we perform this vital ministry to the homeless community.

As you know, the gospel is "the good news". Evangelism is simply telling other people about the gospel of Jesus Christ. Our fallen world is in desperate need more than ever of this good news and sharing it is vital to us, as Christians. It is so important we are commanded to do so in Mark 16:15 which reads, "He said to them, 'Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation'."

I have a simple method I use in street ministry: (1) Approach, (2) Listen, (3) Ask questions, (4) Witness, (5) Pray, and (6) Leave. We also distribute communion and hand out Bibles.
