Council Meeting 3rd of August 2020

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. on the 3rd day of August 2020 by the Council President Fritz Leifeste. Pastor Paul opened with a prayer.

MEMBERS PRESENT: Joyce O'Connell, Chris Kinsey, Fritz Leifeste, Kara Martinez, Linda Ortegon, Betty Thane, Bee Rose, Marie Williams, John Ulrich, and Pastor Paul Zwarich.

MINUTES: Fritz motion to accept the July 2020 Calvary Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes. John motion to accept the minutes and Chris second the motion. Council Approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT: John Ulrich. Overall looking good for the year. The July 2020 Treasurer's Report was approved as presented.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT: Joyce O'Connell. The yearly average is pretty consistent. The Financial Report was accepted as reported. Pastor said he was encouraged by this report considering all we've been going through this year.

CORE TEAM REPORTS

Education - Marie Williams - Nothing new to report.

Fellowship - Kara Martinez. Nothing new to report.

Service and Justice – Betty Thane. Several members of the congregation delivered the items collected for the Family Shelter yesterday. It was a very good donation. There are not any new projects until the fall.

Worship – Bee Rose. Bee ask if more than two people were needed to run ZOOM during Sunday Worship Services? John said he and Pedro had it covered and it was not necessary for Bee to request any others to help. John also said it's wasn't necessary for Bee contact either of them each week.

Evangelism - Barbara Walker. Absence

PASTOR'S REPORT:

Pastor Paul presented the Pastor's Report. Two weeks ago he attended the farewell reception for Pastor Diane. Her last day was July 31st. This coming Sunday, August 09, will be his first Sunday Serving in Miles. Pastor canceled his July vacation due to travel restrictions. Pastor will attend a Dean Meeting tomorrow with the Bishop and the Deans in the Synod. Sunday after the Miles service he will be leaving for Alabama to take Bob to the University. Joyce volunteered to lead the worship service on the 16th and he had already sent her most of the material. There will be a ZOOM Synod assembly. He will have more information on it tomorrow. Pastor said it's his understanding the delegates we elected, Barbara and Margaret, will need to reregister. If they have already registered they will need to talk to the Synod office about it. Pastor's September vacation has been canceled. Pulpit supply will not be needed on the 20th. The COW Conference Meeting is scheduled in Abilene on October 3, 2020. Pastor will be on vacation January 02 through January 08, 2021. Pulpit supply will be needed for January 03, 2021. ZOOM worship services are still being held. As most of you've heard there are numerous people in nursing homes suffering from the coronavirus. Some predict an uptick in cases once school resumes, so we don't know what our fall schedule will look like. Pastor said he extended an invitation to Miles and to our congregation to join him in a joint bible study that will start on Tuesday evenings in September. It's a twelve lesson study from the book "Life Lessons from Genesis", a book written by Max Lucado. Confirmation classes will begin after Labor Day via ZOOM. Steve Tucker's mother is not doing well. She has cancer. Pastor did the Commendation of the Dying last Saturday. Keep her and Steve's family in your prayers.

OLD BUSINESS

The council moved to continue Sunday Worship Services per ZOOM through August. John moved to accept the motion and Bee second the motion. The other church gatherings, the AA Group, will continue to meet outside the building. Music was added to the "ZOOM" Sunday Worship Services and Pastor has received a lot of good feedback. Holy Communion will be given to those in attendance and more music will be added to Sunday Services. Pastor will have more detail on how that will be handled when he gets back from vacation. Replacing the roof is on Harrison Roofing's schedule. The switch to Suddenlink Internet Service is still on going. Shelly will be scheduling the tuning of the church piano when she schedules her piano to be tuned, but she's not ready to schedule hers yet. The AC is working now and it's cooling!

NEW BUSINESS

The fall adult bible study will meet Tuesday evenings starting the Tuesday after Labor Day in September. It will be a joint bible study with Miles. Confirmation will held on Tuesday as well before the adult bible study also per ZOOM. Pastor said "We should have a better idea if in person Sunday school classes can be held the next council meeting. Marie suggested having the high school and middle school students, who are not in confirmation, attend the adult bible study. Pastor said they could easily participate. Fritz said Bug Express did come and spray. They ask if we wanted to schedule a visit quarterly. A onetime spray is guarantee for thirty days.



The quarterly spray is guaranteed for 90 days. Fritz will get the prices so the council can make a decision the next meeting. Bee motion to tablet it to next month and Betty second the motion. The council agreed. It's been suggested to move the council elections to the fall congregation meeting the last Sunday of October. All agreed. John said the premiums with our current insurance have been going up. General Liability, Property and Workers Comp. The policy expires the first of December. He wanted to let us know he is getting information and rates from other companies. He will provide information to the council as it becomes available. John said the Budget Committee met and even though our yearly average is pretty consistent overall. The committee suggested we buckle our belts since the cash flow is up and down.

Meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

Something to ponder... Ordinary discipleship -


